2 3 **ARTICLE 9: DESIGNATIONS AND REGENTS AWARDS** 4 5 Part B: Regents Awards 6 7 9.B.1 The Board of Regents may award Honorary Degrees, University Medals, or 8 Distinguished Service Awards as follows: 9 10 Honorary Degrees recognize outstanding achievement in one or more of the (A) 11 following areas: intellectual contributions, university service, philanthropy and/or 12 public service. 13 14 (B) University Medals recognize those persons whose achievements and contributions are particularly associated with the university. 15 16 17 Distinguished Service Awards recognize those persons whose achievements and (C) 18 contributions are particularly associated with the state and/or nation. 19 Honorary Degrees 20 21 The Board of Regents may award Honorary Degrees in recognition of outstanding 22 intellectual contributions, university service, philanthropy, and/or public service. To 23 receive an Honorary Degree, candidates selected, or candidate's representative, must 24 attend a university commencement within a two-year period following selection. 25 26 9.B.2 University Medals and Distinguished Service Awards 27 28 The Board of Regents may award University Medals to recognize persons (A) 29 whose achievements and contributions are particularly associated with the 30 university. 31 32 The Board of Regents may award Distinguished Service Awards to recognize (B) 33 persons whose achievements and contributions are particularly associated with 34 the state and/or nation. 35 36 University Medals or Distinguished Service Awards are generally awarded at (C) 37 commencements but may be awarded on other occasions, as determined by the Board. 38 39 40 9.B.<mark>3</mark>2 Candidates for Nomination Procedures relating to the awarding of honorary degrees, 41 university medals, and distinguished service awards are stated in Regent Policy 9.A. 42 43 Anyone may submit nominations. Exceptions as to who can be nominated are as 44 follows:

48	CNo current public officials may not be nominated. Public officials are elected or
49	appointed officials in policy making positions with the ability to directly affect the
50	university through an official act.
