- Direct attention to WWI memorial


# **SITE ORIENTATION**

#### THE RED CROSS BUILDING (1918)

#### **History**

In 1917, this site was surveyed by the United State federal government for a possible military tuberculosis treatment hospital. Many World War I soldiers returned from Europe with pulmonary diseases that resulted from prolonged exposure in trenches, underground bunkers and battlefields. Colorado was selected as an appropriate location for the new treatment hospital because of its clean, dry air and many days of sunshine.

The Red Cross Building was one of the original 48 stucco and hollow-tile buildings dedicated on October 13, 1918 as part Army General Hospital 21, later renamed the Fitzsimons Army Hospital (1920). The Red Cross Building was located in the center of the site, adjacent to the infirmary building, tuberculosis wards, surgical ward, operating pavilion and mess hall. It was completed prior to the main General Hospital 21 (1919) and functioned like a community center, providing entertainment for patients facing long periods of hospitalization. After the completion of General Hospital 21, the base was also used to instruct and train medical officers. By the 1920s, the renamed Fitzsimons Army Hospital was described as the largest military hospital in the world, with the largest tuberculosis hospital in the United States.

#### **Community Presence**

The Red Cross Building provided entertainment to military patients. It had a large central space that was open to the second level with a stage and fireplace. This was used for vaudeville, films, and concerts, among other forms of entertainment. In the 1920's the Red Cross offered two dances per month for enlisted men and civilians on duty. The building later included several pool tables, games, and a lending library. It continued to function as an entertainment and community center until base closure.

#### **Architectural Character**

U.S. Army standard plan, which included a cross-shaped building with central lantern. It was constructed using smooth stucco and shaped parapets to conform to the style of other buildings on the base. It was a two-story, west-facing building with 12 bays across the main body of the building. The Red Cross Building's dimensions were 120'x120.' It had a gable roof with overhanging eaves and a central octagonal lantern situated at the transept. It was located in the exact center of the new base, and was surrounded by a landscape quadrangle similar to one found on a typical college campus.















CENTRAL LANTERN AT TRANSEPT






**NURSES**


#### **SITE CONCEPT- TIMELINE MILESTONES**

- RADIAL TIMELINE EXPRESSES THE SIMULTANEOUS IMPACT THROUGHOUT TIME

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


- TELLING THE STORY OF EACH ERA THAT THE RED CROSS WAS OPERATING













### SITE CONCEPT- COMFORT / SEATING / SOCIABLE



- RED CROSS FACILITY HAD A STAGE IN THE EAST WING OF THE MAIN FLOOR. SEATING IS ARRANGED FACING THE EAST AS A NOD TO THE STAGE SEATING
- SEATING SCATTERED THROUGHOUT SITE ALLOWS FOR USERS TO PICK AND CHOOSE WHERE TO SITE
- SITE WIDE SEATING HARBORS A SENSE OF DISCOVERY. WHEN A USER CHOOSES TO SIT IN A DIFFERENT QUADRANT, THEY WILL BE ENTERING A NEW SUBJECT OF FOCUS IN THE TIMELINE



### SITE CONCEPT- PROSPECT / REFUGE / SEASONALITY




- MUCH LIKE THE RED CROSS FACILITY, THE TREES ARE THE CONSTANT THAT STRETCH THROUGH ALL FOUR QUADRANTS AND TIMELINE
- TREES OFFER A REFUGE FROM THE ELEMENTS
- TREE BOSQUE IS ONE OF THE MAIN DRIVERS TO ATTRACT USERS TO THE SPACE
- TREES WILL PROVIDE SEASONAL COLOR AND INTEREST TO SIT YEAR ROUND


