What makes Colorado Springs a great place to live?

Colorado Springs sits at the base of Pike's Peak, aka "America's Mountain," which was the inspiration for Katharine Lee Bates' "America the Beautiful." This towering 14,115-foot mountain is a must see for any in the area. Ride up to the summit on the Cog Railway or drive up the historic Pikes Peak Highway. The doughnuts at the top are said to taste better from being made at 14,000 feet.

For athletes, "Olympic City USA" does not disappoint. The city's natural landscape and high altitude prove the perfect home for professional and casual athletes. Home of the United States Olympic Training Center, the city offers a perfect environment for recreation. You can also find the Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC, a second division soccer team, playing games on Weidner Field in the heart of the city.

Are you an athlete yourself and up for a challenge? Try the Manitou Incline (simply "The Incline" to locals): a 2,744-step trail that gains 2,020 ft of elevation in just under 1 mile. Not for the faint of heart, this extreme trail has an average grade of 41% and is 68% at its steepest. Going up the Incline just six times is the elevation gain equivalent of hiking Mt. Everest from Base Camp to summit.

If you are looking for something less intense, try one of Colorado Spring's many trails and parks, including Garden of the Gods. Ranked Tripadvisor's No. 16 best Tourist Attraction in the United States in 2024, this free park allows for easy hiking with stunning views of natural rock formations. The Garden of the Gods is also a hotspot for rock climbers seeking a unique climb.

Looking for more indoor activity? Visit the Broadmoor, one of three Forbes Five Star hotels in Colorado. This luxury resort is known for its beautiful grounds, delicious restaurants, and exceptional experiences. Or visit the Colorado Springs Philharmonic for live music concerts.

As the home to the Air Force Academy, as well as four military bases, Colorado Springs has a rich military history. Take a walk through this very history at the Peterson Air and Space Museum.
