Design Review Board Member Search Announcement

A search will commence for a new member of the University of Colorado Design Review Board (DRB) in early 2021, with a goal of selecting and appointing a new member no later than July 2021.

The DRB is a six-member committee appointed by the university president to advise design teams about plans for construction on the four CU campuses. The DRB is charged with formally reviewing and approving project proposals at four stages of design: pre-design, concept design, schematic design, and design development.

Per university policy, the DRB is comprised of four professional architects, one landscape architect, and one architect or engineer with an expertise in sustainable building design. Members are appointed to five-year terms and are compensated at a rate of \$125/hour. The DRB typically meets two to three days a month.

Required qualifications: The appointee must be an architect or engineer with demonstrated experience in sustainable building design and energy systems.

Preferred qualifications: The appointee should demonstrate their ability to give constructive feedback about design proposals and have experience working as a member of a team.

The applicant should be willing to attend monthly in-person meetings in Denver or on-campus (once COVID-19 restrictions are lifted).

The submittal should include:

- a cover letter;
- a resume with education, work experience, and accomplishments; and
- a list of three references familiar with the applicant's level of experience in sustainability and building systems (reference information should include name, phone number, email, and relationship to applicant).

A selection committee comprised of representatives of the DRB and all four CU campuses will identify no more than six candidates to interview. The top finalist will be forwarded to the university president for consideration. Interviews will be held in March and April.
