\$12.35 billion Economic Impact in FY 2015-16

- \$8.3 billion economic impact from CU operations at all campuses
 - 53,440 employees (directly employed or supported)
 - \$4.0 billion from employee salaries and benefits
 - \$1.7 billion from research activity
 - \$834 million from student and visitor spending activity
 - \$486 million from construction activity
- \$4.0 billion impact from University of Colorado Hospital and Children's Hospital Colorado on the CU Anschutz Medical Campus.
 - 27,016 employees (directly employed or supported)
 - 475,000 patients served
 - 2.6 million treatments

- \$3.5 billion total budget
 - \$197 million in state funding
- \$924 million in sponsored research awards
 - \$606 million in Federal awards
 - \$317 million in Non-Federal awards
- 61,016 enrolled students
- 252,000 alumni residing in Colorado

- 32,400 faculty, staff & student workers
 - 20,250 regular faculty & staff

Methodology

- Data
 - Detailed expenditures include voucher transactions, procurement card and travel cards reconciled to year-end close financial statements
 - Student spending and student visitation based on fall 2016 survey
 - Employment and salary data provided by postal code, by campus
- Impact Modeling
 - Analysis utilized IMPLAN for input-output modeling
- Not included in estimated impact:
 - Patient spending external to hospitals
 - Fundraisers, Contract Vendor activity (athletic event vendors)
 - Contributions of alumni living in the state
 - Community service, outreach
