


#### Overview

- Continue to experience tight labor conditions
- Overarching economic issues include:
  - worker shortages, high inflation, rising interest rates, and disrupted supply chains
- Entering a slow economic period
- Universities drive economic impact from multiple sources
- CU system impacts every single county in Colorado
- Employed 34,600 faculty/staff, 13,000 students in FY2021-22
- Spent total of \$4.8 billion on operations, research, and construction in FY2021-22
- Total university + hospitals impact: \$13.3B
- Contributes to the skilled labor force, industry growth, and innovation


Total impact from CU Campuses + Anschutz affiliate hospitals



### Key Findings

- The University of Colorado generated an economic impact of \$8.7 billion in FY2022 for the State of Colorado
- The University of Colorado's affiliates, including the University of Colorado Hospital and Children's
  Hospital Colorado generated an additional economic impact of \$4.6 billion
- The university directly employed a total of 47,513 faculty, staff, and student workers; \$2.4B in salaries.
- The university operated on \$4.7 billion in revenue, with a significant portion relating to sponsored
  programs and other restricted fund activity
- The total economic impact for each CU campus is as follows:
  - CU Boulder, \$3.3 billion; CU Anschutz, \$3.9 billion; CU Denver, \$798 million; UCCS, \$440 million
  - Anschutz Affiliate Hospitals, \$4.6 billion


#### U.S. Real GDP




### Colorado Employment

YoY change: +4.1% or +113,000 jobs From Peak: +2.2% or 62,500 jobs




### Colorado Employment Change








