IT Governance

All governance issues feed into CU's IT Governance Committee as an escalation point.

Data Governance Executive Council

One data executive per campus and CU System will consult with Trustees and Stewards prior to voting on multicampus data decisions and multi-campus data governance priorities.

The executive council collaborates with data trustees and executive subject matter experts.

Data Trustees

 One owner per domain per campus will be consulted by the Data Governance Executive Council for domain specific decisions.

Executive Subject Matter Experts (SMEs)

Identified and consulted as needed for specific Data Governance Executive Council decisions.

Data Stewardship Councils – One per business domain

One data steward and one data custodian per campus and CU System will consult with subject matter experts and working groups (if available) on business domain-specific, multi-campus data decisions.

These councils report up to the Data Governance Executive Council.

This network is made up of subject matter experts (SMEs) and other stakeholders who are interested in data governance. They are informed of Data Governance discussions and may be consulted by Operating Model groups, if needed.
