Boulder – Fall 2017 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- Undergraduate transfer students have increased more than 17 percent from fall 2016 with resident transfers up over 100 students from last year.
- Undergraduate underrepresented minority enrollment is over 4,600 students which is a 10.5 percent increase from fall 2016.
- Freshman persistence is at 87 percent, an increase over the historical average of 84 percent.
- Students are taking almost 12,200 credit hours offered exclusively online or via distance this fall, which represents a 3.7 percent increase from fall 2016.
- Total international enrollment is more than 3,000 students, up slightly from last year.
- Graduate enrollment is up 3.2 percent, with an increase of more than 100 resident graduate students.

Denver – Fall 2017 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- For the first time, CU Denver has reached 15,000 enrollments.
- This is the 5th consecutive year of a record-size freshman class.
- The freshman class is especially diverse, with more than 55% being students of color.
- Colorado residents account for 87% of undergraduate students and 81% of graduate.
- Overall, better than budget by 0.8%
- Undergraduate enrollment up by 2.8%
- New freshmen up by 0.7%, and transfer undergraduates up by 1.7%
- Continuing undergraduates up by 3.4%
- Graduate enrollment down by 1.4%
- International enrollment up by 1.3%

Anschutz – Fall 2017 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- Based on preliminary estimates, Colorado residents account for 81% of all enrolled students.
- CU Anschutz overall enrollment is experiencing moderate enrollment increases as projected. Enrollments capped by accrediting organizations.
- Nursing has strong growth in the Dual Enrollment ADN and Nursing BS program, in which students earn their Nursing BS while completing an Associate Degree in Nursing from one of several community colleges.
- The College of Nursing is also seeing robust enrollment in the BS to Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program, which is starting in Fall 2017.
- The Master of Public Health program continues to experience strong growth, with enrollment anticipated to increase by 8.5% at Anschutz.
- Compared to budget, CU Anschutz enrollment is on track.

UCCS - Fall 2017 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- For the first time, UCCS has surpassed 12,400 enrollments.
- Total enrollment is 4.0% over fall 2016.
- New academic programs show growth with significant increases in the Elementary Education and Exercise Science programs.
- Colorado residents account for 82% of new first-year students and 85% of all enrolled students.
- 4,222 students are taking at least one online class, which is 34% of main campus students.
- International student enrollment is down 7.7%, following the nationwide trend.
