

Boulder – Fall 2018 Preliminary Enrollment

Boulder – Fall 2018 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- Undergraduate transfer students have increased 14 percent from fall 2017 with resident transfers up over 50 students, a 5.9 percent increase, from last year.
- Undergraduate racial/ethnic minority enrollment is over 7,350 students which is a 7.9 percent increase from fall 2017.
- Freshman persistence is at 87.53 percent, an increase over the historical average of 84 percent.
- Students are taking more than 15,500 credit hours offered exclusively online or via distance this fall, which represents a 19.4 percent increase from fall 2017.
- Total international enrollment is almost 3,100 students, down about 1 percent from last year.
- Graduate enrollment is up 3 percent, with an increase of more than 70 resident graduate students.

Denver – Fall 2018 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- This is the 6th consecutive year of a record-size freshman class.
- The freshman class is especially diverse, with 57% minority.
- Colorado residents account for 86% of undergraduate students and 81% of graduate.
- Overall, better than budget by 0.8%
- Undergraduate enrollment up by 2.8%
- New freshmen up by 16%
- Continuing undergraduates up by 2.8%
- Graduate enrollment down by 1.8%
- International enrollment down by 3.5%

Anschutz – Fall 2018 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- Based on preliminary estimates, Colorado residents account for 80% of all enrolled students.
- CU Anschutz graduate and professional programs are experiencing moderate enrollment increases as projected. Enrollments capped by accrediting organizations.
- Nursing continues to see growth in the Dual Enrollment ADN and Nursing BS program, in which students earn their Nursing BS while completing an Associate Degree in Nursing from one of several community colleges.
- The College of Nursing is also seeing robust enrollment in the RN to BS Program and the BS to Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program.
- CU Anschutz enrollment is estimated to be approximately 2.9% higher than budget.

UCCS – Fall 2018 Preliminary Enrollment (cont.)

- UCCS continues to grow, now at 12,574 enrollments.
- Total enrollment is 1.2% over fall 2017.
- 2,933, or 28%, of undergraduate students are currently receiving Pell.
- 2,394 of our students have a military affiliation, or 19%.
- 36% of our students are taking online coursework.
- International student enrollment is down 13.6%, following the nationwide trend. This also accounts for the decrease of 1.6% in Non-res students.
