Progress

CU Boulder

- CU Boulder is becoming more diverse and its strong academic programs and research opportunities continue to draw residents and nonresidents.
- Incoming freshman class for fall 2019 includes more women, first-generation scholars, racially and ethnically diverse students – and the highest average GPA this last decade.

CU Denver

- Second largest incoming freshman class.
- Freshman class is especially diverse, with 60% minority.

UCCS

- Upper division classes experiencing approximately 4% growth in credit hours.
- International enrollment is up from the previous year.

CU Anschutz

- College of Nursing is experiencing robust enrollment in the BS to Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program, a main driver behind the College's 5.14% enrollment growth from Fall 2018.
- Colorado residents are estimated to account for 79% of all enrolled students.



Challenges

CU Boulder

- Like some other U.S. universities, 210 freshman international enrolled compared to 259 in Fall 2018.
- Transfer students declined after increasing the last several years. Transfer population is down 64 students but more of transfers are women and students of color.

CU Denver

- Continuing undergraduates down by 3.1% from budget.
- Total nonresident enrollment down by 4.8%, with particular weakness in domestic students.

UCCS

- Transfer enrollments are down 20% over last year
- First time student enrollments are down 4.5% over last year
- Student credit hours are down 3.7% compared to budget

CU Anschutz

- Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences PharmD program enrollments declined by 6.7% from Fall 2018 census.
- Colorado School of Public Health Enrollments declined 8.1% from Fall 2018 census.



FY 2019-20 Balancing

CU Denver

- Utilize a portion of Emergency Tuition Stabilization Plan funds to cover a share of the anticipated revenue shortfall due to lower enrollments.
- Budget reductions will be determined through a campus process that engages stakeholders (Chancellor's Advisory Committee on Budget).

UCCS

- Utilize a portion of Emergency Tuition Stabilization Plan funds to cover a share of the anticipated revenue shortfall due to lower enrollments.
- Due to early indications of lower enrollment, UCCS chose not to allocate mid-year incremental budget increases for part-time and student faculty, staff promotions, and hourly.
