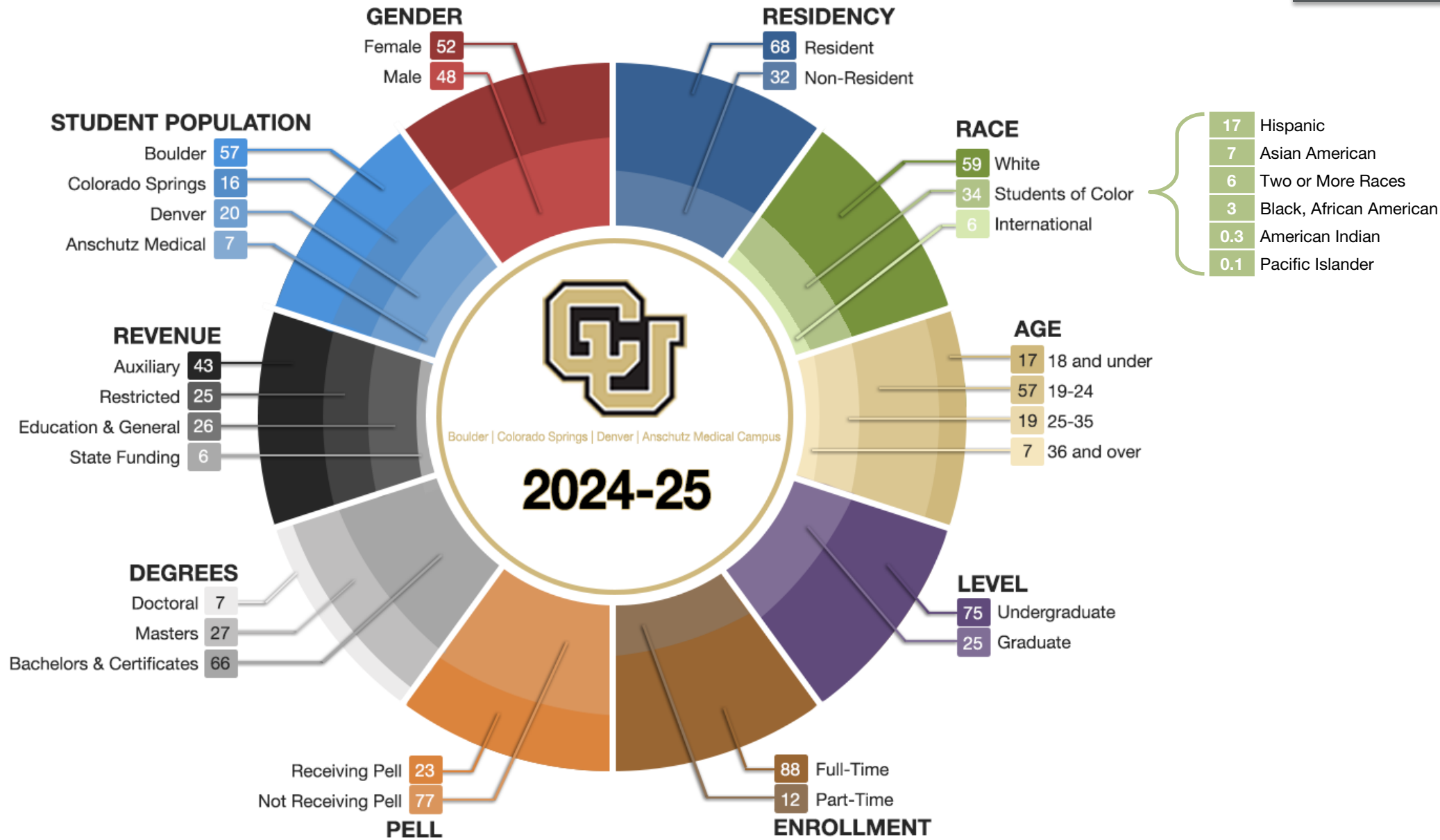

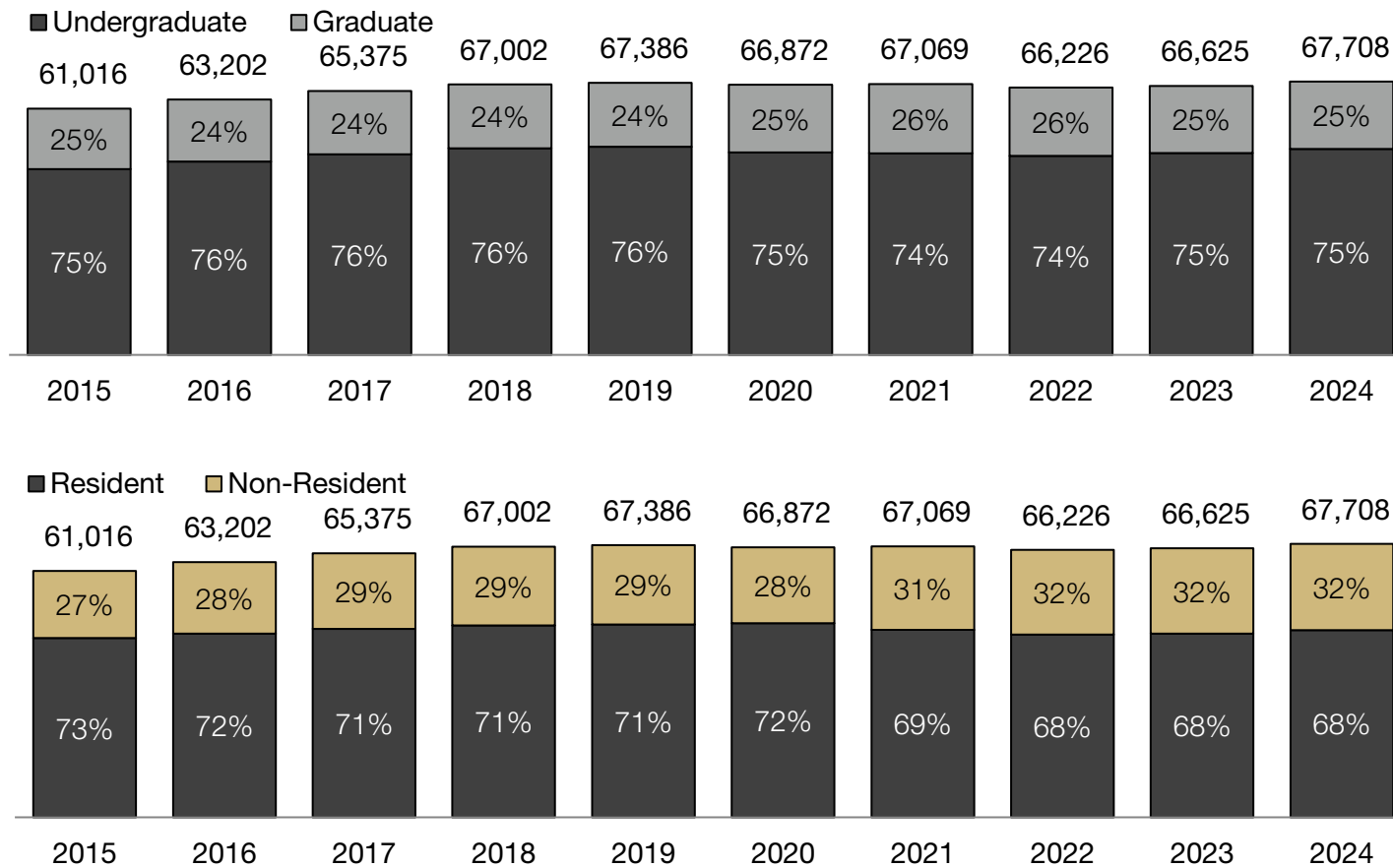

## % Change From Prior Year

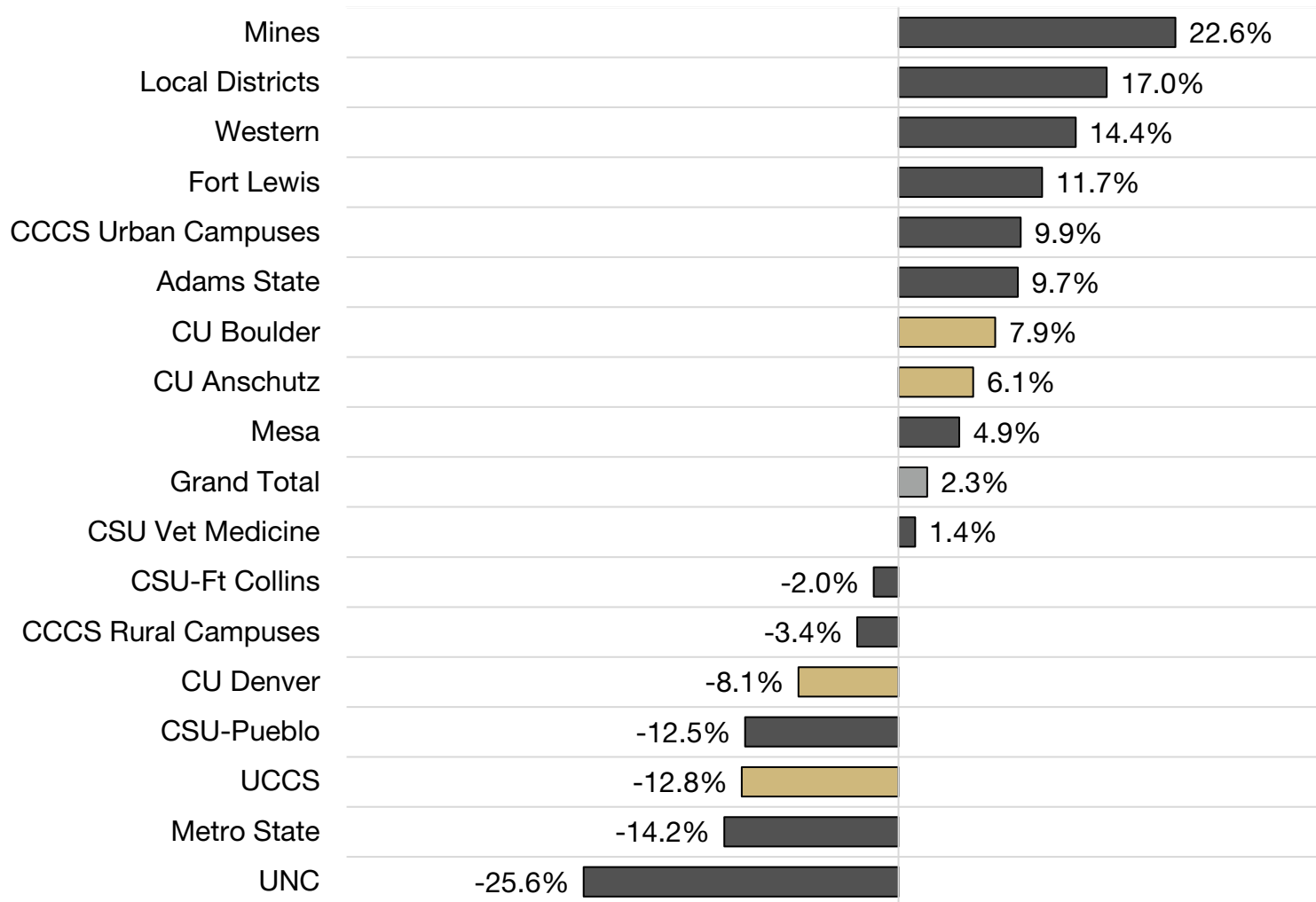

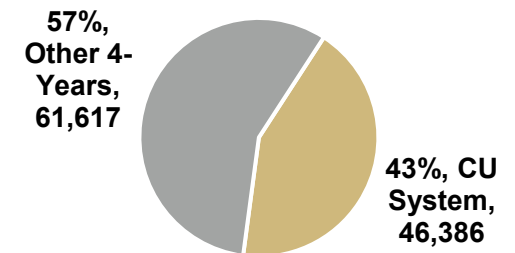

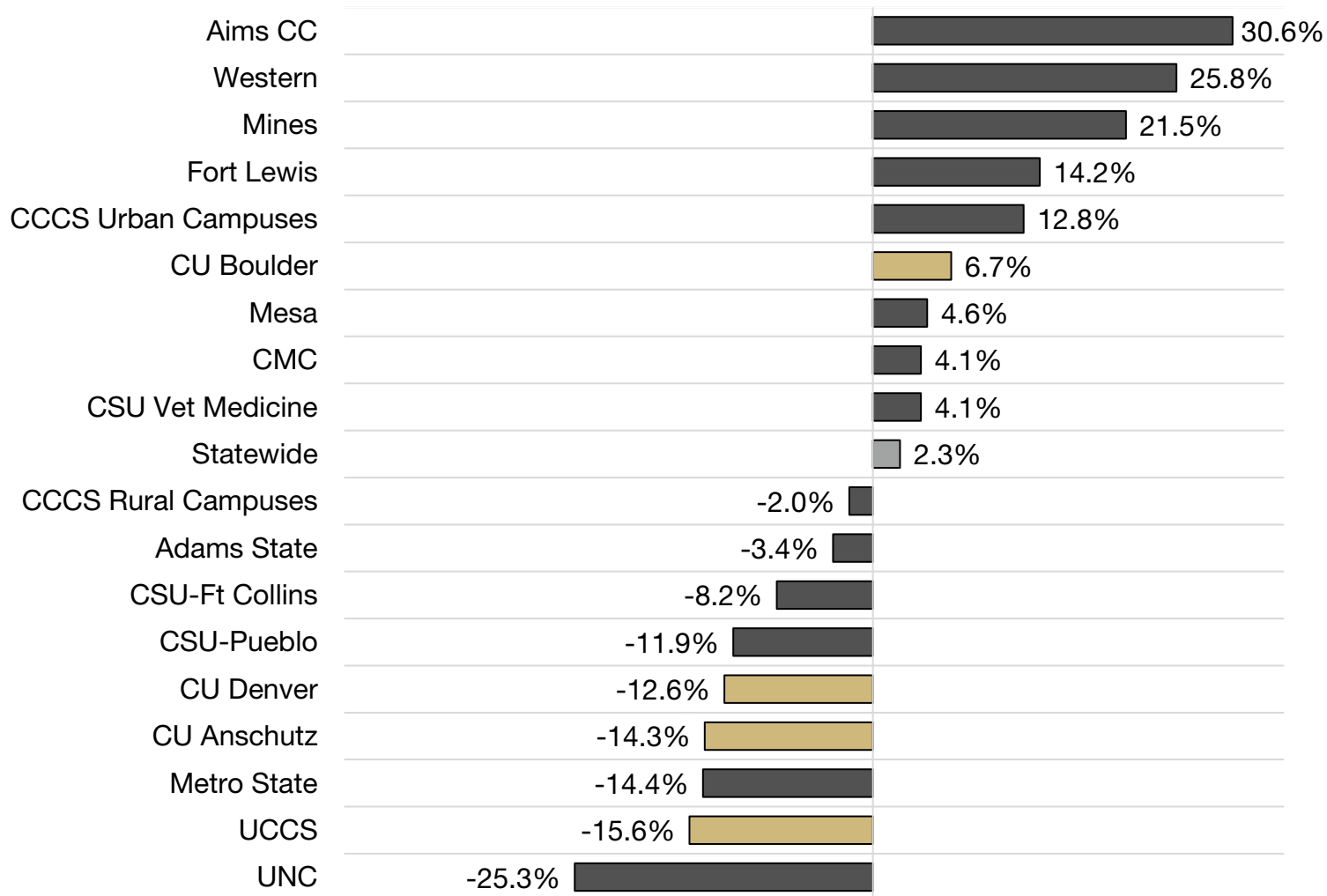

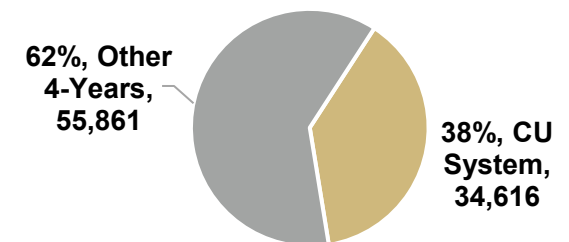

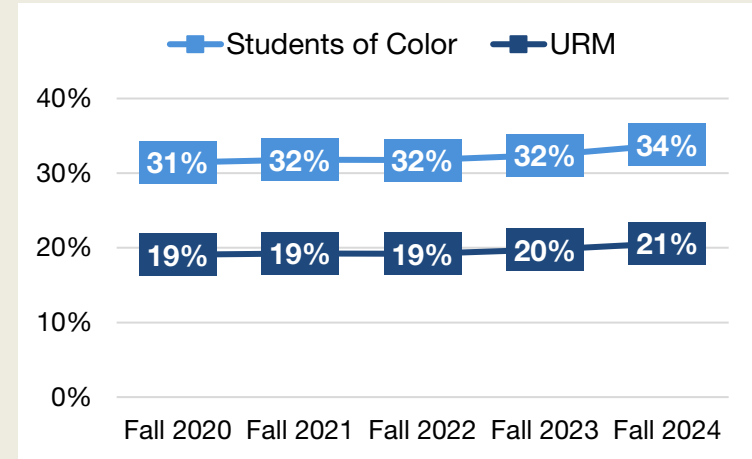

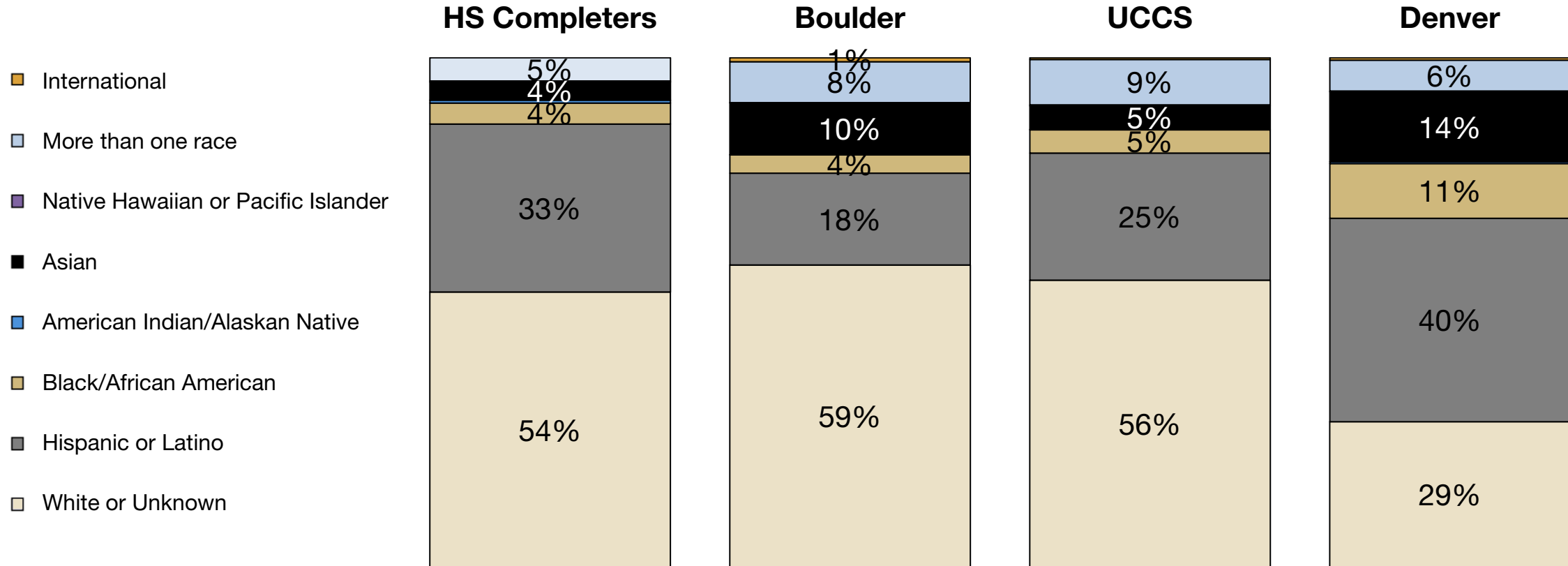

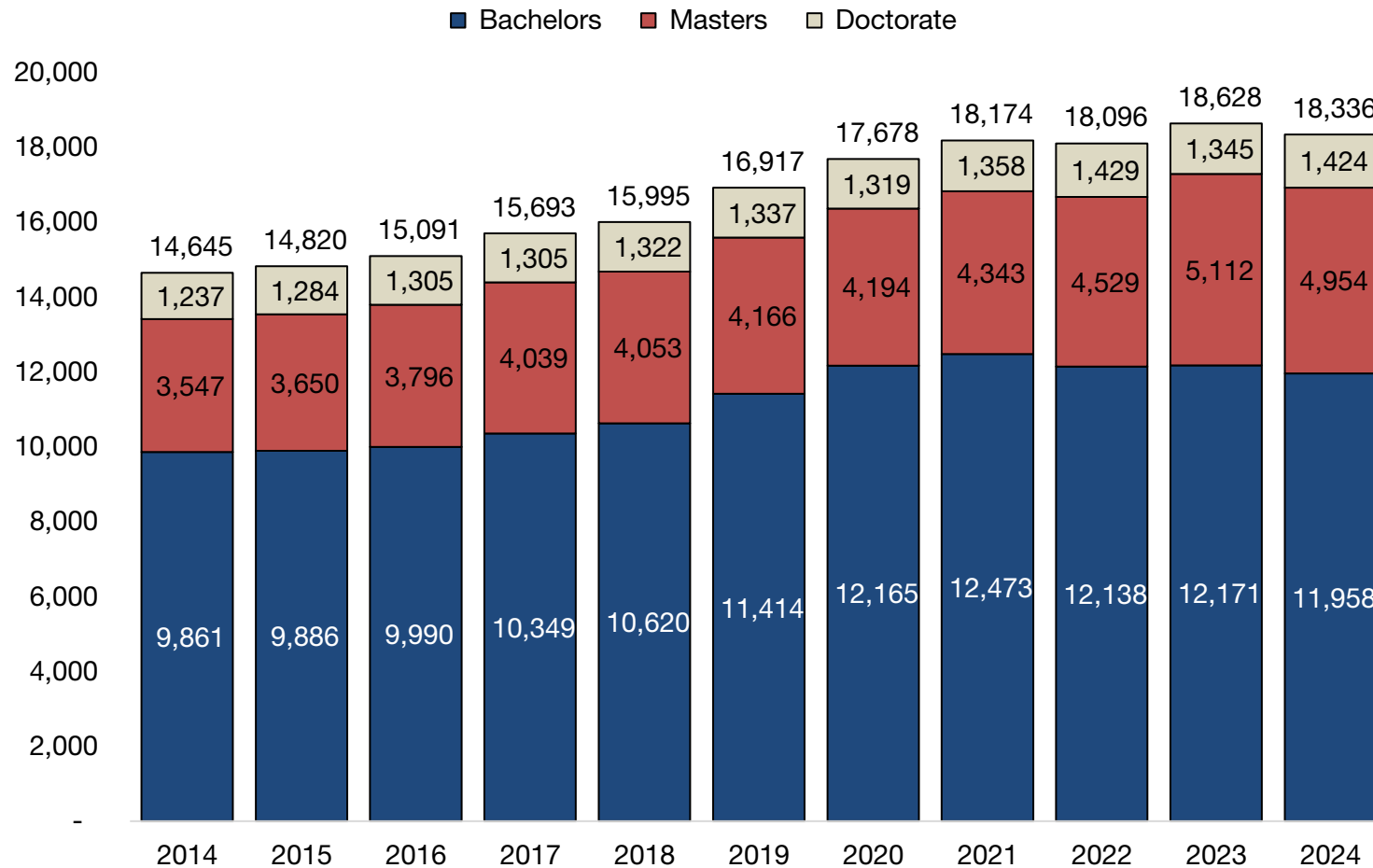

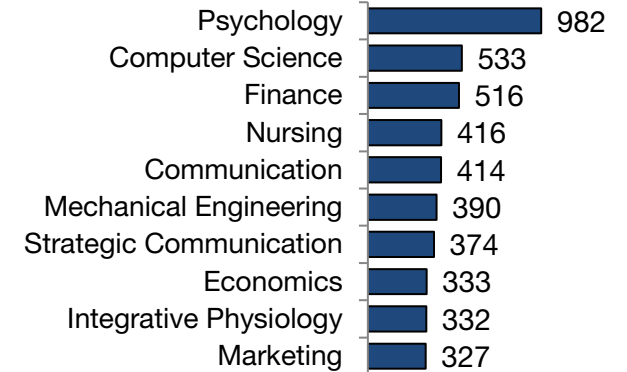

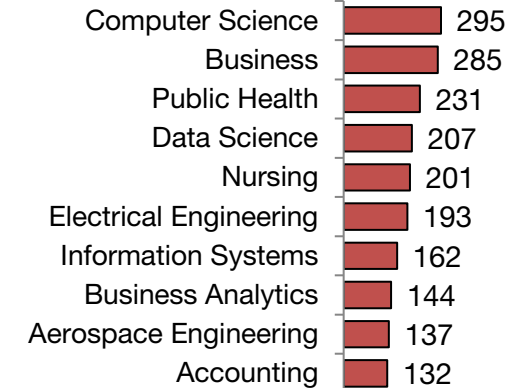


## Top Fields of Study Awarded (FY 2024)

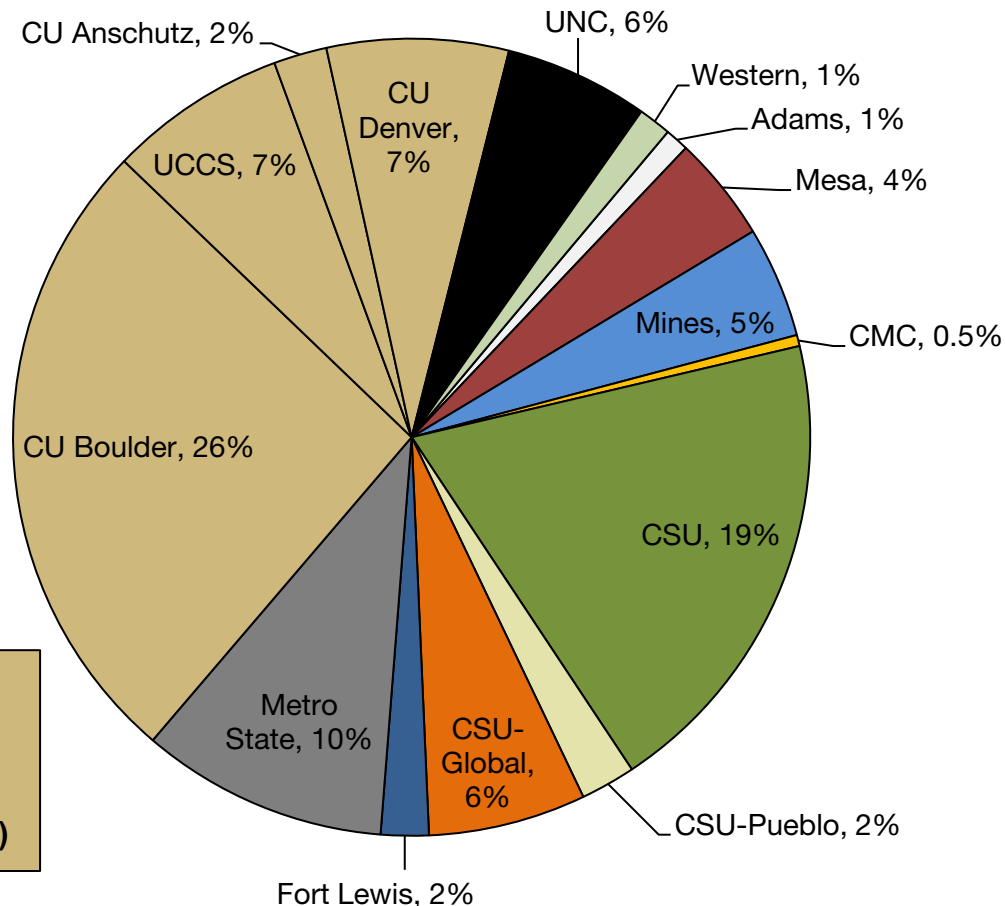

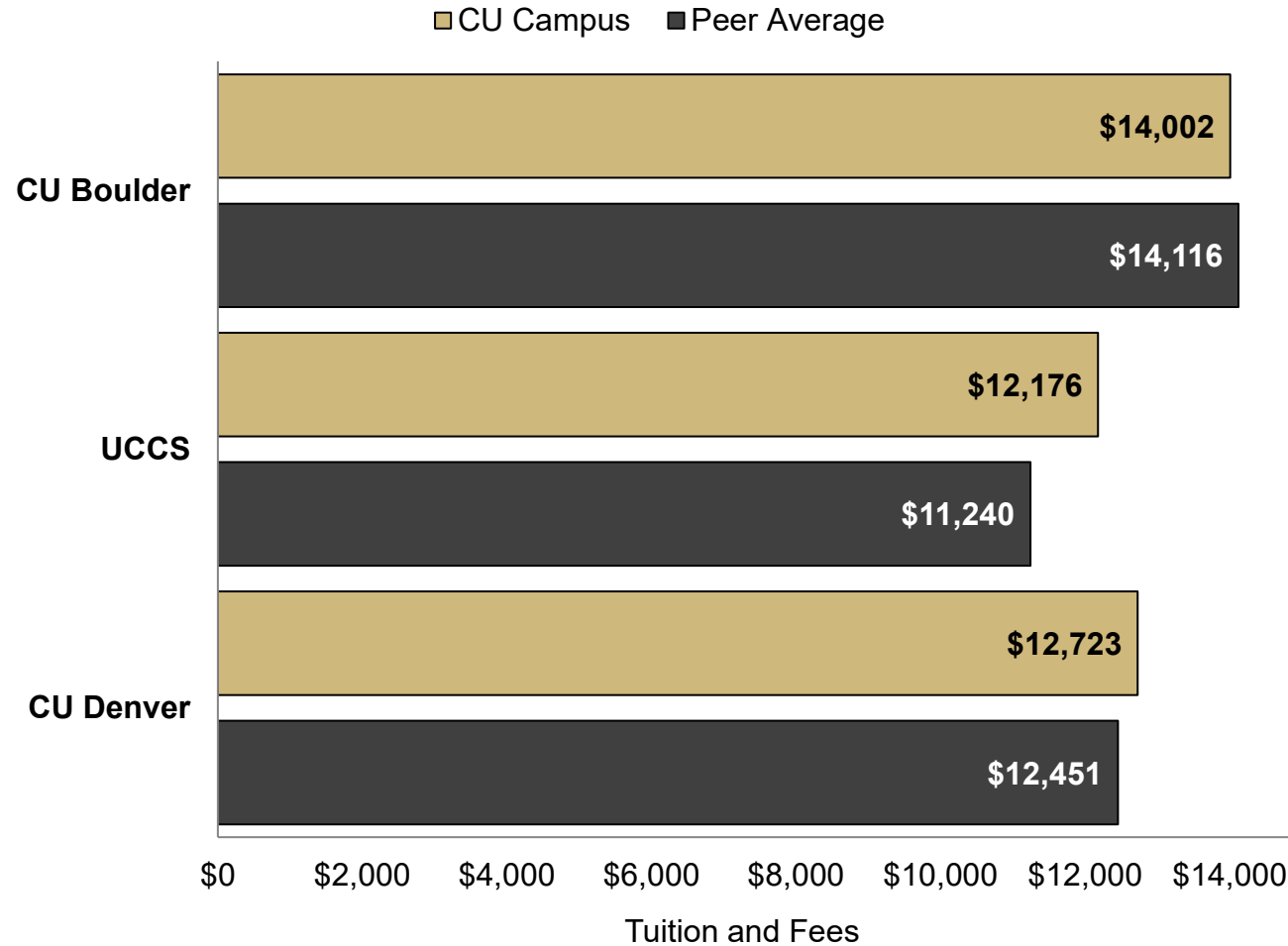
6-Year Graduation Rates (First-Time Freshman)

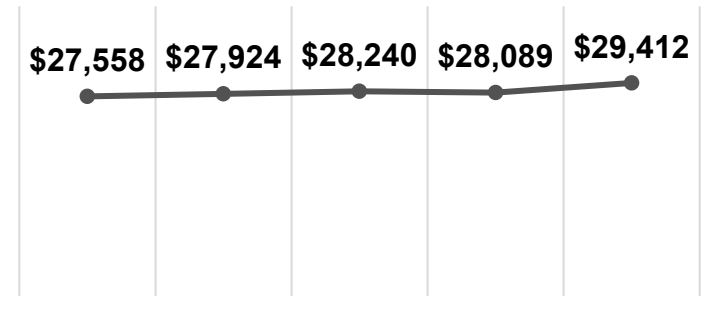

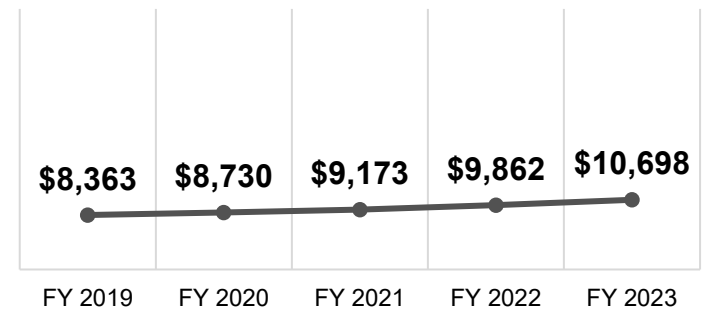

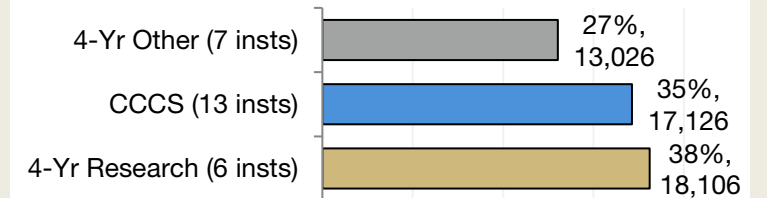
# Student Financial Aid: Federal Pell Grants

Federal Pell Grants, the largest source of federally funded grants, are awarded solely based on financial need (academic grades and extra-curricular activities aren't a factor). Recipients must meet general federal student aid eligibility requirements. The maximum Federal Pell Grant award for the 2024-25 academic year is \$7,395.

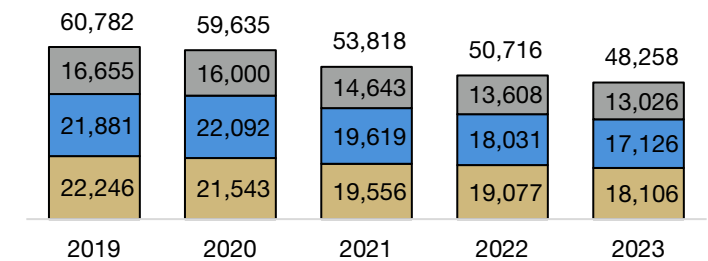

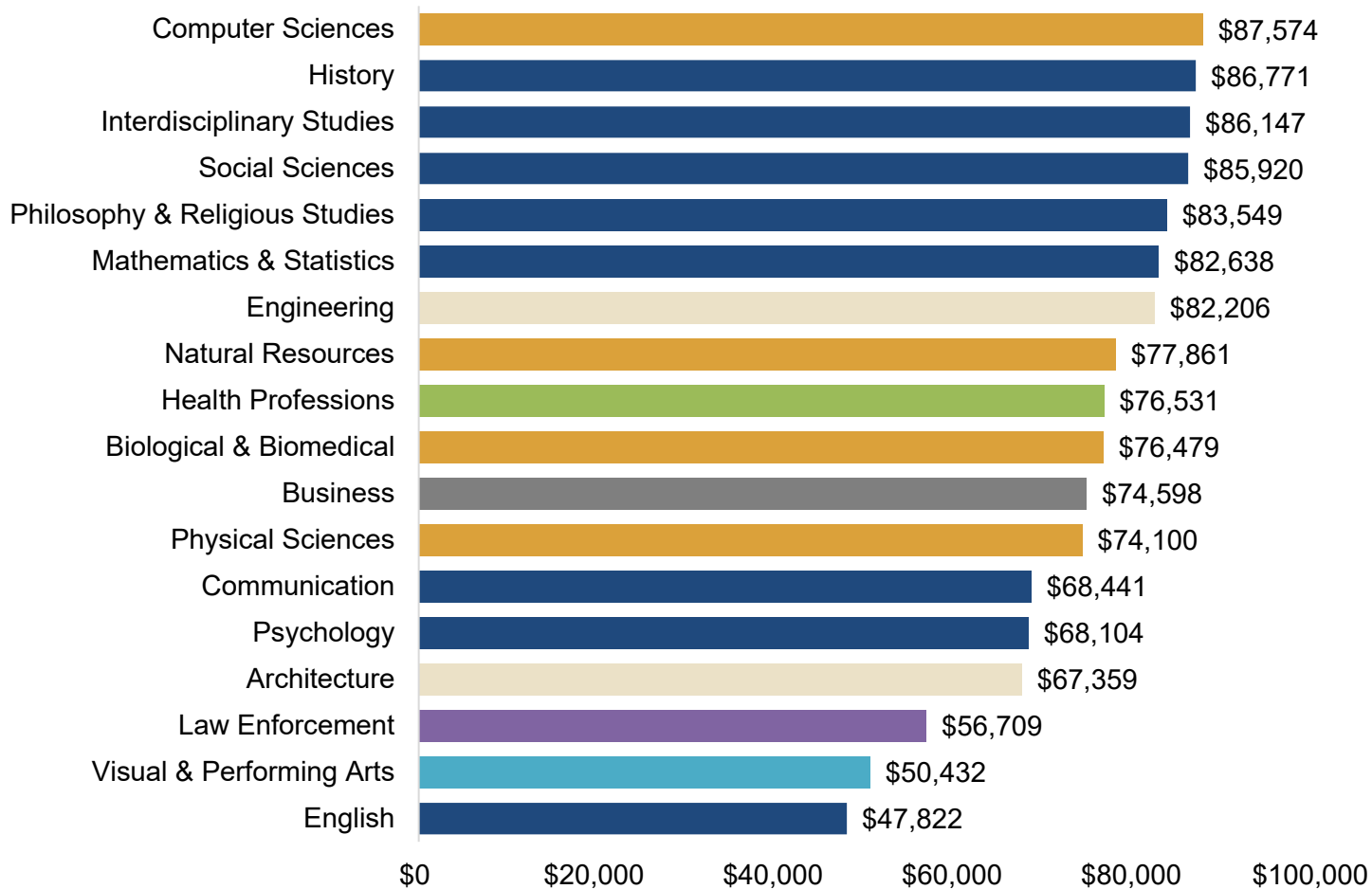
Number of Students Enrolling in Online Courses

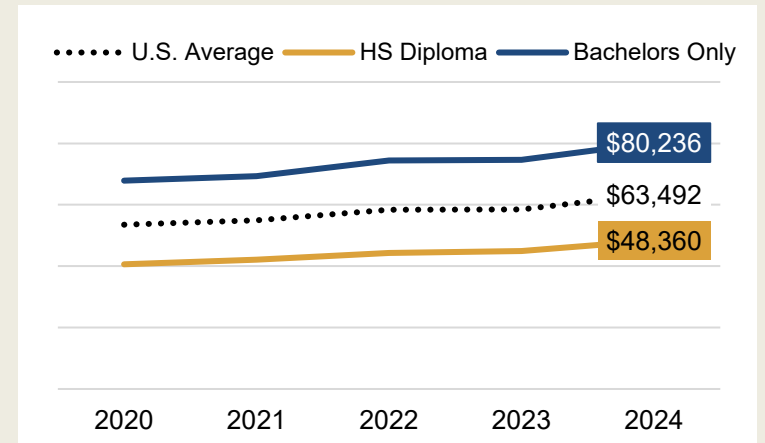

## % Total Faculty Retained by Campus

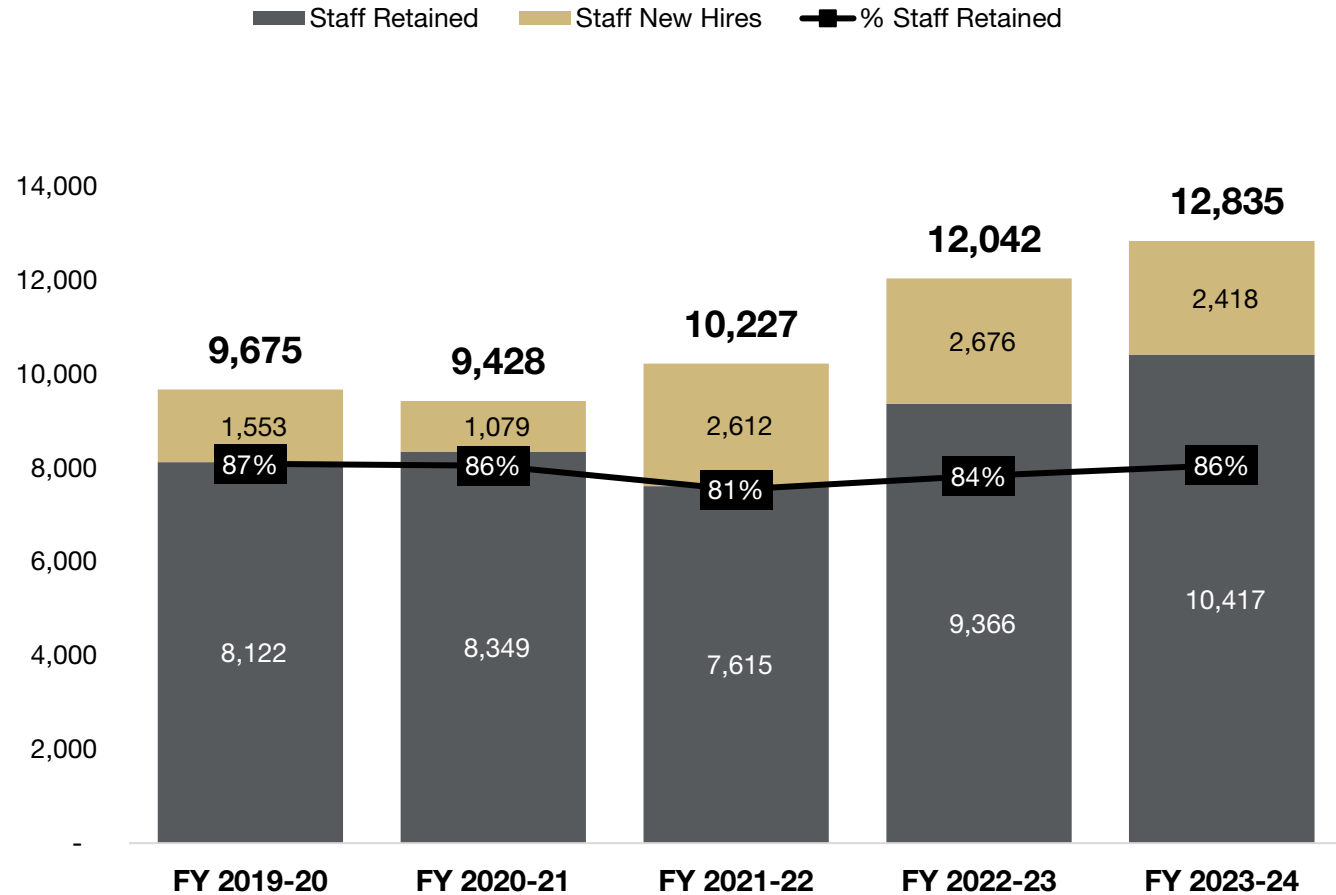

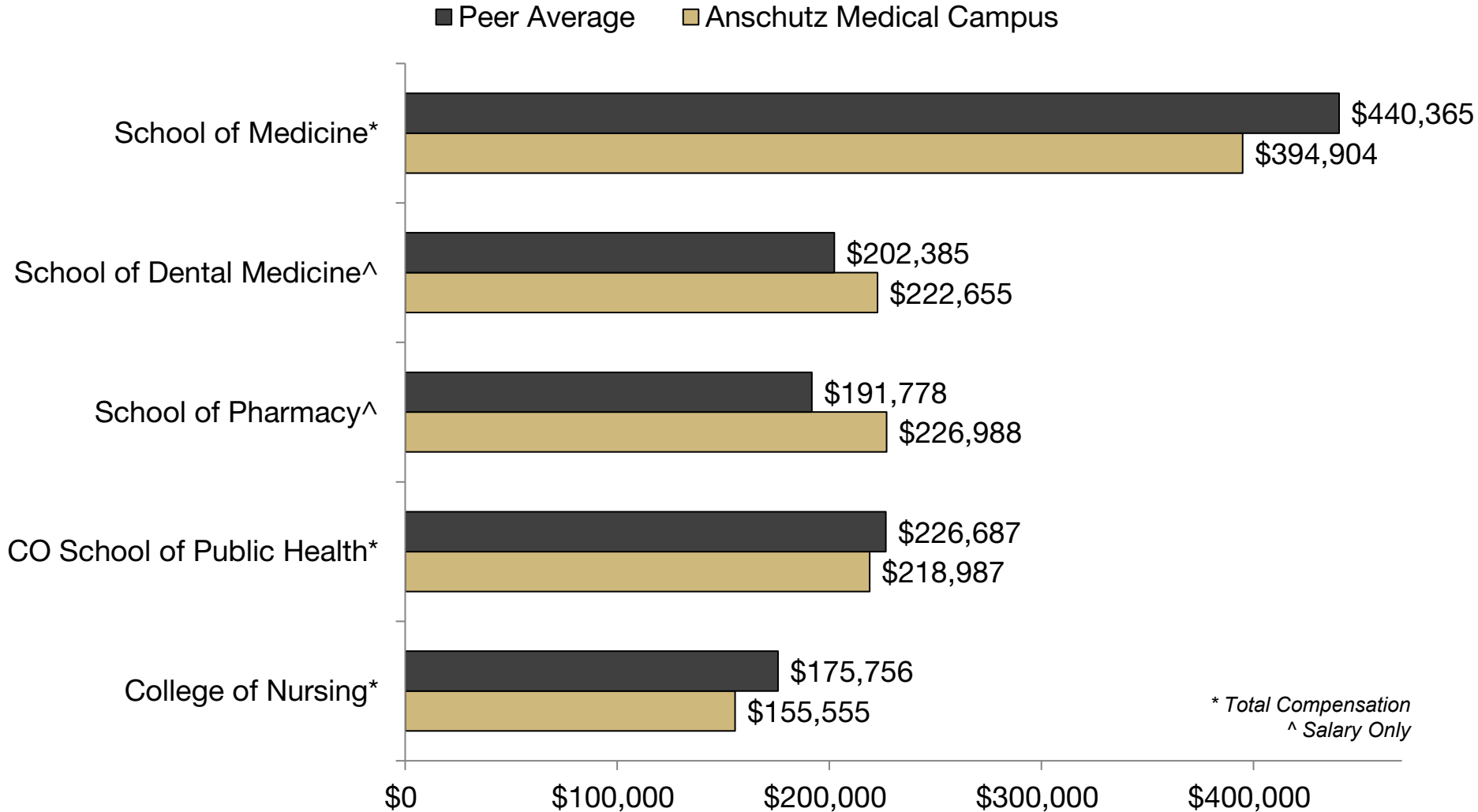

# How are Dollars Spent?

Illustration below represents the share of Operating (Education & General) budgeted expenditures. In FY 2024-25, CU System approved operating budget was \$2.1 billion. Tuition and fee revenue makes up 65% of the operating budget, followed by 18% state funding, and 17% other E&G.

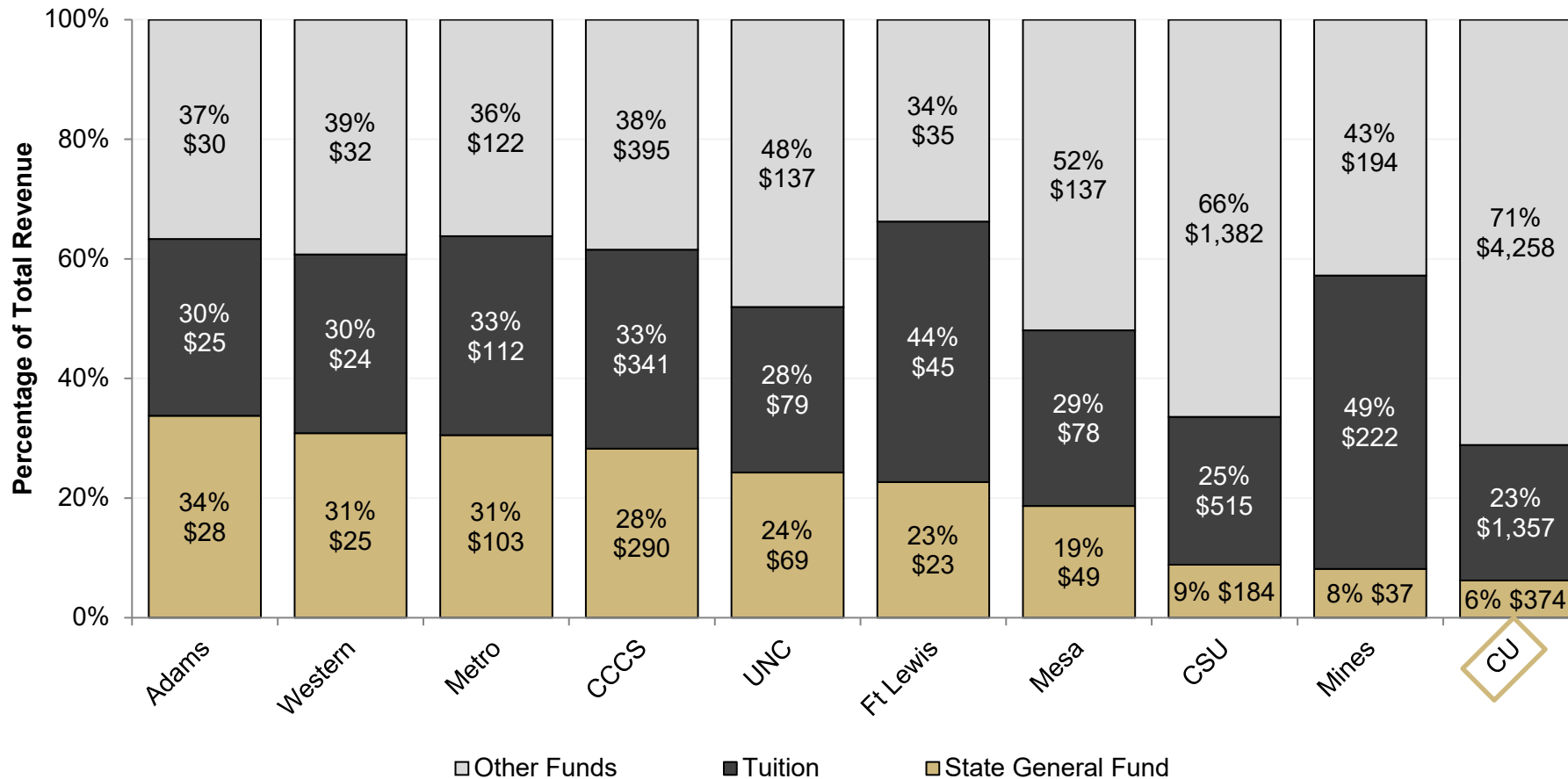

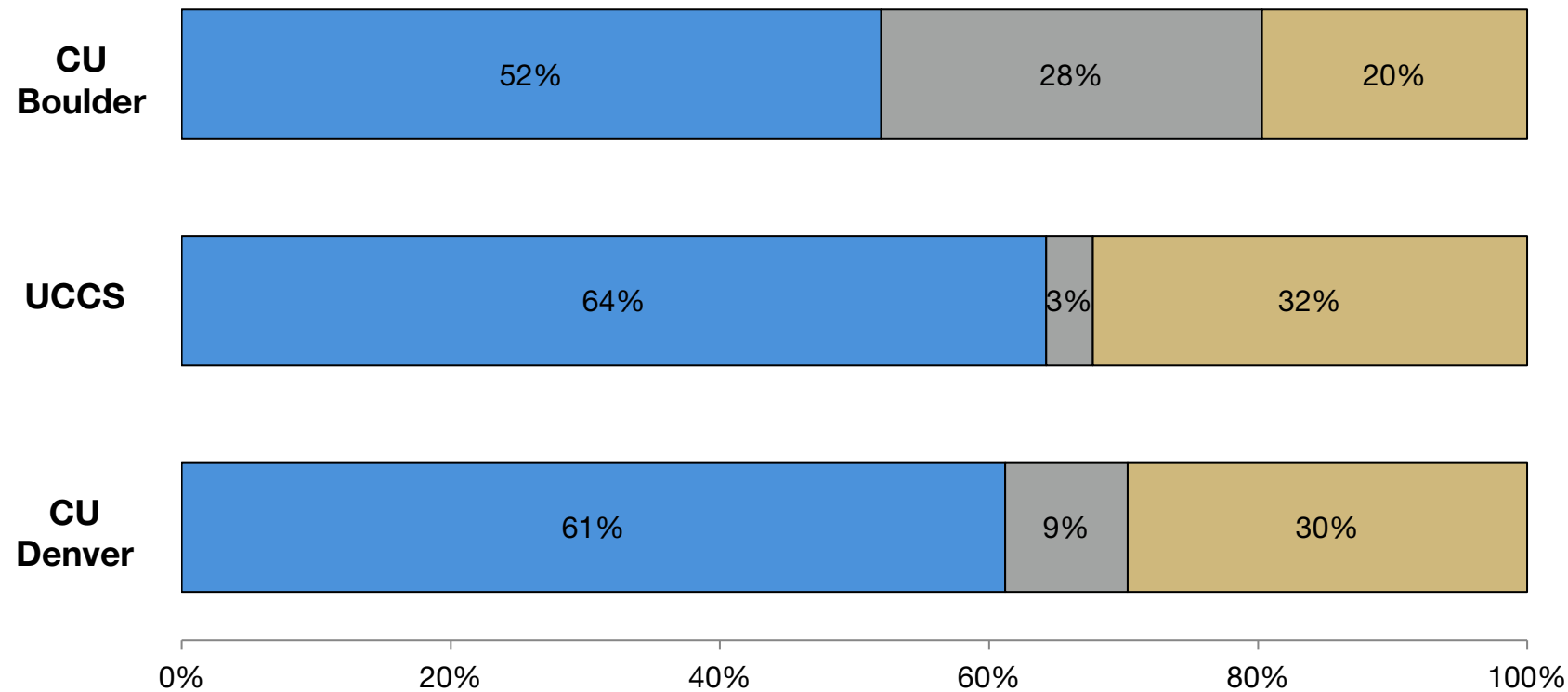

Undergraduate and Graduate Share of the Cost of Education, based on cost per student FTE

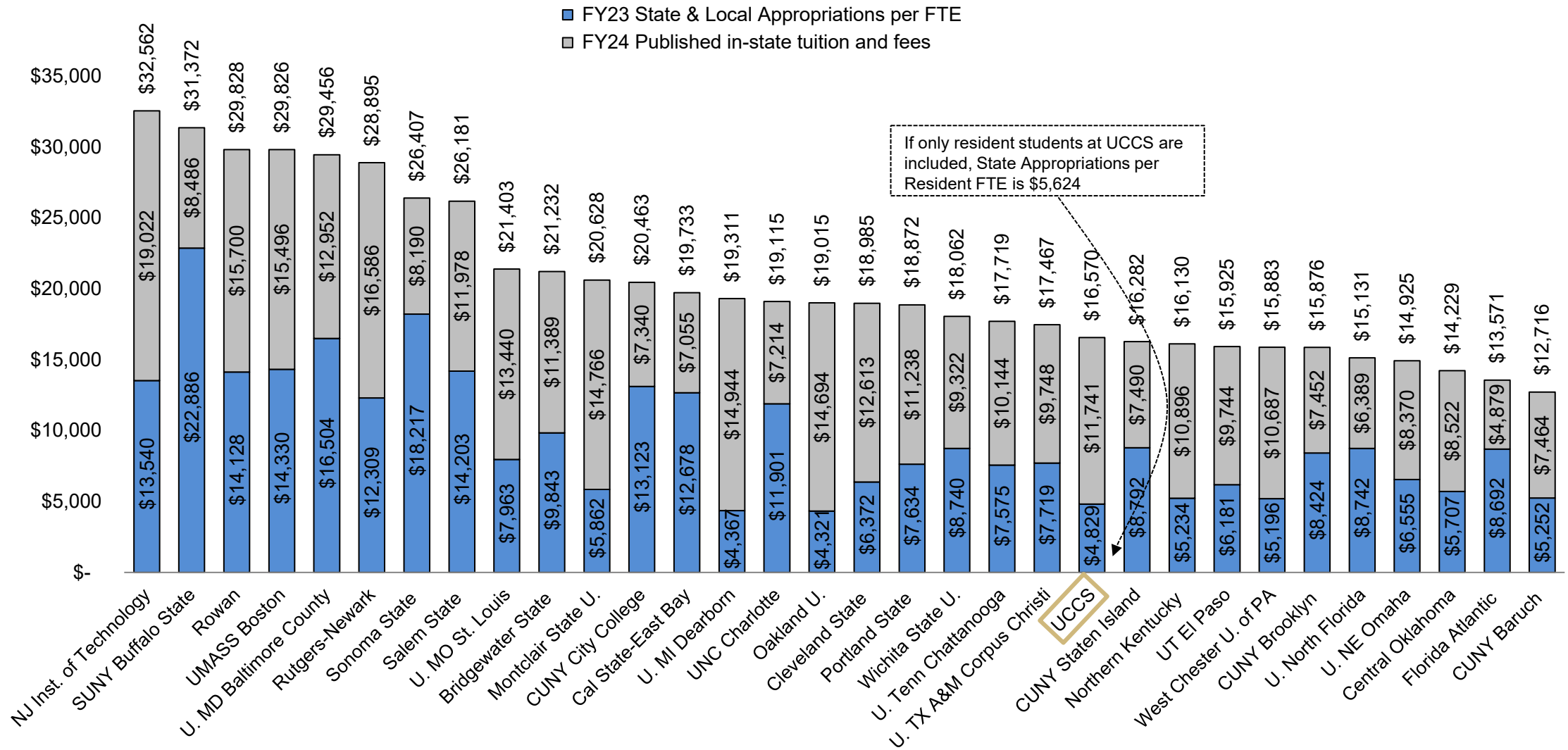

## Awards by Type (% Annual Change & Total in millions)

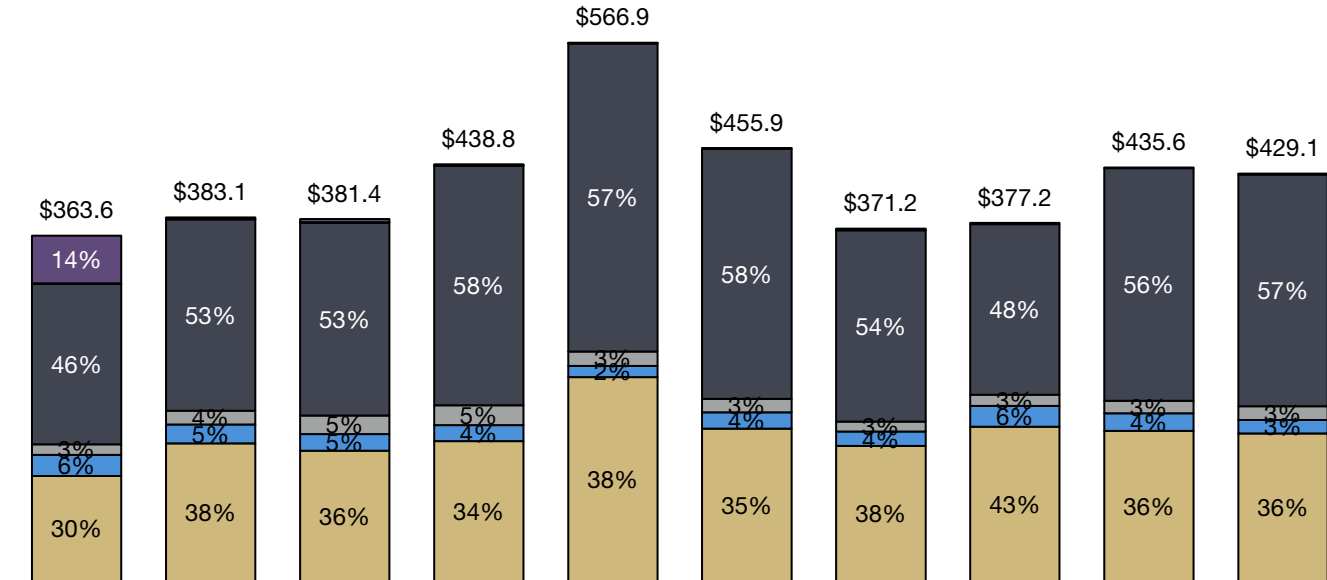

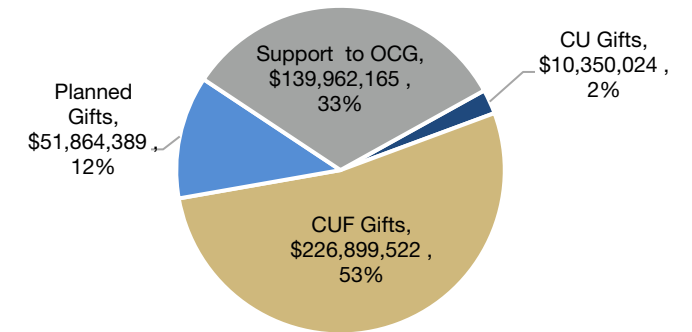

### About the CU Foundation

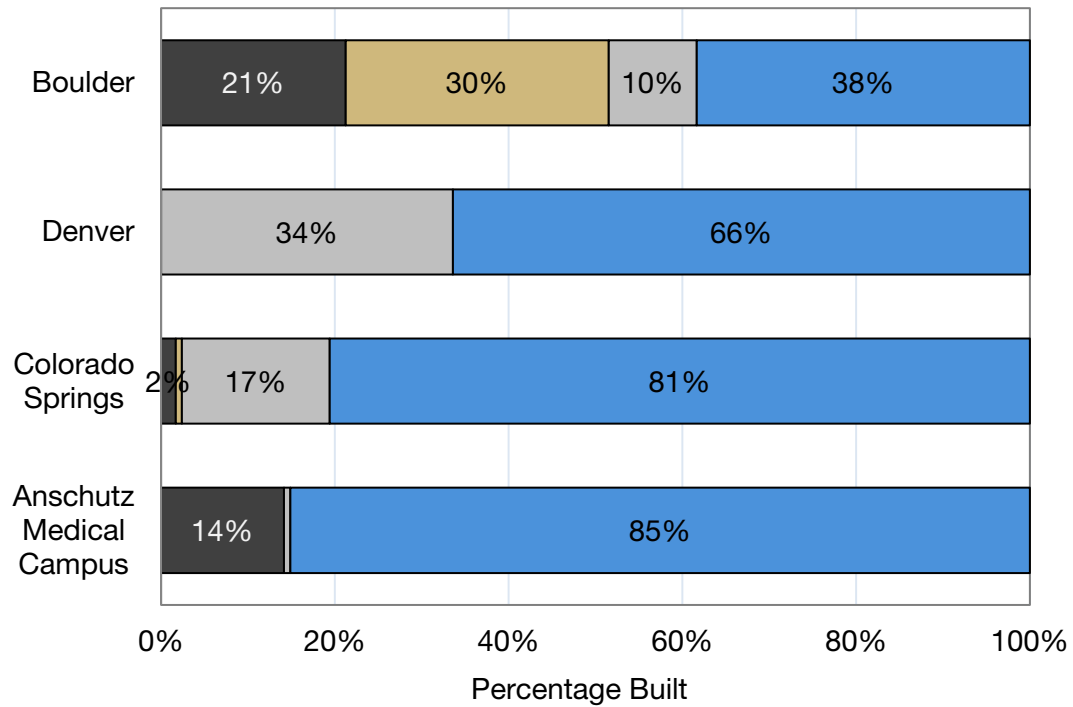

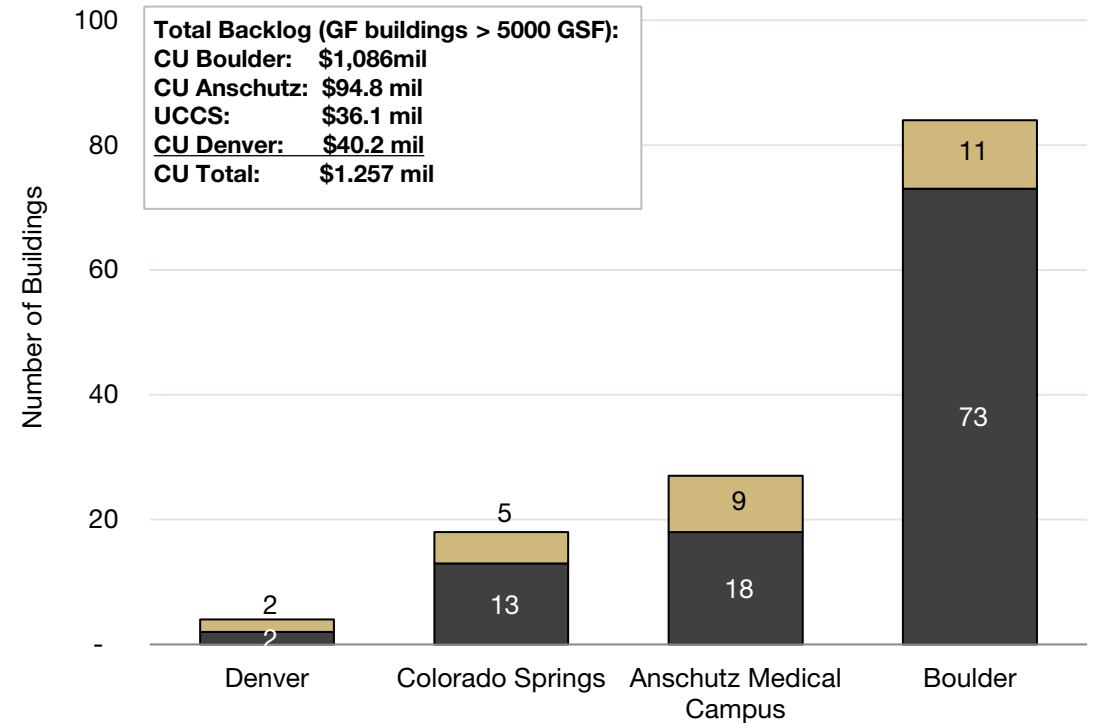

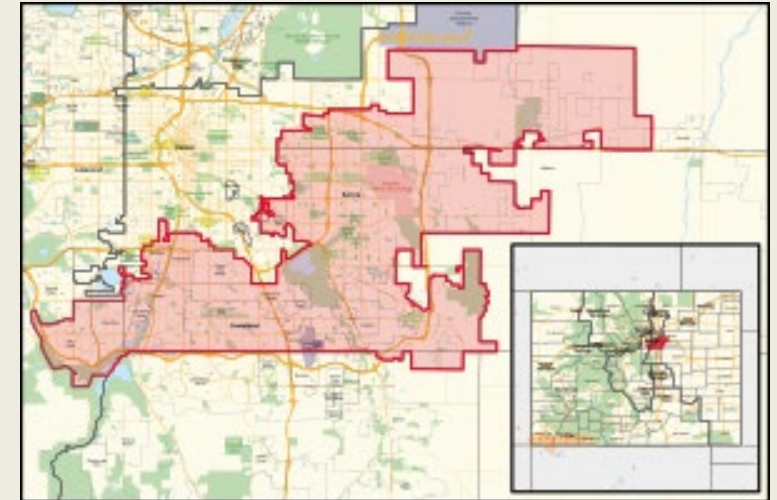

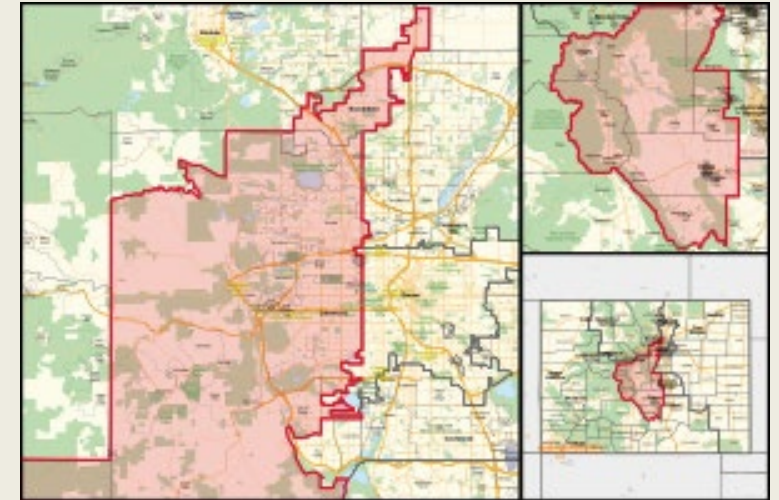
