Key Findings

- The University of Colorado generated an economic impact of \$9.7 billion in FY2019 for the State of Colorado.
- The University of Colorado's affiliates, including the University of Colorado Hospital and Children's Hospital Colorado generated an additional economic impact of \$4.5 billion.
- The university directly employed a total of 38,975 faculty, staff, and student workers (24,519 faculty and staff); **\$2.1 billion** in salaries.
- The university operated on **\$4.6 billion in revenue**, with a significant portion relating to sponsored programs and other restricted fund activity
- Student and visitor spending totaled \$927 million and \$43.5 million respectively
- The total economic impact for each CU campus is as follows:
 - CU Boulder, \$4.2 billion
 - CU Anschutz, \$3.9 billion
 - CU Denver, \$823 million
 - UCCS, \$591 million





Key Findings continued

- Impact is driven from operations, research, construction, student/visitor spending
- Illustrates the broad labor shed and economic impact beyond the campuses
- Shows the impact of R1 institutions through the economic contribution of \$1.2 billion in research
- Report limited to the impact of the university as a business; societal impact much greater
- Impacts excluded from the study:
 - alumni,
 - football/conference impacts,
 - tech transfer


