










FY18 Anschutz Foundation Spendable Balance \$147.1M

FY18 Top Balances and Purpose

- \$33M from Anschutz Foundation (ex: Personalized Medicine, Innovations, etc)
- \$3.9M for Cancer Center to build leadership team, faculty support & lung cancer research
- \$3.6M for Ophthalmology general research support
- \$3.4M for Hemophilia/Thrombosis Center support
- \$2.4M Anschutz National Mental Health Innovation Center support
- \$2M for recruitment of new faculty members for Personalized Medicine Program
- \$2M for Head & Neck Cancer Program support
- \$1.8M for Alzheimer's and Neuro-Degenerative Disease research professorship
