

Policy 7A: Admissions

7.A.1 Campus Admissions Policies

- (A) The chancellor or <u>chancellor's</u> designee shall be responsible for developing and implementing campus admission policies in accordance with Article 7, Part A.
- (B) In formulating policies and procedures for admission to a campus, the campus administration shall collaborate with <u>appropriate</u> members of the campus faculty <u>as appropriate</u>. <u>As specified in Regent Policy 5.A.1.(B)(1), faculty have the principal role in originating academic policy and standards including admission criteria.</u>

Policy 7B: Standards of Conduct

7.B.1	Student Standards of Conduct			
	(A)	The chancellor or chancellor's designee on e	ach c	<u>campus</u> shall establish and

- (B) Standards of student conduct shall provide, at a minimum, that students shall refrain from conduct disruptive of university functions; from injury to persons or damage to property on the campus; and from impeding freedom of movement of students, school officials, employees, and invited guests to all facilities of the university. Interference in any manner with the public or private rights of citizens, conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of any person, and damage to property are prohibited.
- (C)(B) The Each campus shall have defined policies and procedures for investigating allegations of student conduct violations that provide due process appropriate for the matter under investigation. These procedures shall contain the basic elements of procedural due process, and as the chancellor deems appropriate, an appeals process.
- (D)(C) Students, faculty, or administrators shall not be bound to decisions made under conditions of coercion or intimidation, or where force and violence are present or threatened.

7.B.2 Disciplinary Action for Standards of Conduct Violations

- 22 (A) The Board of Regents delegates to the chancellor, or chancellor's designee, the 23 authority to determine sanctions for standards of student conduct violations, 24 including but not limited to, suspension and expulsion.
 - (B) Suspension or expulsion imposed by one University of Colorado campus shall apply to all other University of Colorado campuses.
 - (C) After the suspension period has expired, a student who has been suspended is eligible to reapply for admission to the campus imposing the sanction or any other University of Colorado campus.
- 30 (D) A student who has been expelled is indefinitely prohibited from enrolling at any University of Colorado campus.

The university reserves the right tomay withdraw financial assistance, regardless of form, and to deny university employment to students who have been sanctioned for violating standards of conduct.

5 6 7 8 9		(A)	During a class discussion, students shall be free to raise questions and express reasoned opinions on the current subject, provided that students follow applicable campus policies and reasonable rules imposed procedures established by the instructor to ensure orderly discussion and progress toward class and course goals.
10 11		(B)	During faculty office hours, students shall be free to question, discuss, and express reasoned opinions on all subjects related to the course.

18 19 20		(A)	As members of the campus scholarly community, sStudents shall strive to attain the standards of academic performance established for each are responsible for learning the content of any course of study in which they are enrolled.

23 24 25		(C) (I	B) Academic freedom notwithstanding, all students shall comply with standards of conduct, and with any reasonable rules procedures for classroom discussion imposed established by the instructor.

Policy 7.D: Student Government Operations

7.D.1 Governing Documents

- (A) A <u>campus</u> student government constitution shall be submitted to the chancellor for review and <u>is subject to the chancellor's</u> approval. <u>It may and</u> then <u>be</u> ratified by a vote of the student body.
- (B) Proposed amendments to a campus student government constitution shall be submitted to the chancellor for consideration and approval. The action of bringing the matter to the student body for a vote shall be subject to chancellor approval. The chancellor's approval to conduct a vote shall not be interpreted as an endorsement of the proposed amendment, but shall indicate the chancellor's acceptance of the outcome of the vote.

7.D.2 Campus Student Government Organizations and Operations

- (A) The administration and the campus student government organization shall develop an operating agreement that establishes the role of student government in managing student government-funded activities and in developing or reviewing campus policies relevant to student issues. The agreement shall not interfere with faculty control over academic policy.
- (B) Student government organizations shall conduct their affairs in a manner that is consistent with campus policies and procedures, the laws and policies of the Board of Regents, and the laws of Colorado. No undue constraints shall be placed upon student government operations.
- (C) Campus student government The operations and budgets of student government organizations are subject to auditing in accordance with Board of Regents fiduciary oversight responsibilities.

7.D.3 Disputes

(A) Should a dispute arise between a student government organization and the chancellor that cannot be resolved, the student government organization may appeal to the president.
