Regent Policy 7.D: Student Government

In May 2024, the Regent Governance Committee approved a five-year schedule for the continuing formal review of all regent laws and policies. As part of this process, **Regent Policy 7.D: Student Government** is currently under review. An initial round of stakeholder feedback on this regent policy was accepted through December 10, 2024. All comments were reviewed, considered, and in some cases, additional edits were incorporated in the proposed Draft 1.

Regent Policy 7.D will be on the agenda for first discussion at the Regents Governance Committee on March 25, 2025. No formal action will occur at that time. Stakeholders may send additional feedback until the close of business on April 24, 2025. Policy 7.D was last reviewed and affirmed by the regents in September 2018. Proposed updates include the following:

- Sections 7.D.1 and 7.D.1(A) are updated to reflect requirements in Article 7.D.2 that student government organizations on the campuses operate in accordance with a constitution.
- Section 7.D.1(A)(1) and (2) are rephrased and slightly restructured to clarify the chancellor’s role and to enhance clarity of the approval processes for student government constitutions and amendments.
- Minor edit in section 7.D.2(A) is included to clarify that “campus” administration works with campus student government organizations to develop appropriate operating agreements.
