

## Skillsoft: Step-by-Step Guide

## Creating Deep Links to Resources in Skillsoft

Deep linking lets you access Skillsoft resources directly from a website or PDF file. When a user clicks a deep link to a course, they are prompted to log on to the employee portal, and then Skillsoft launches the course.

## Notes:

- For security purposes, University Information Services (UIS), asks that you do not insert deep links in emails.
- Employee Learning and Development (ELD) maintains a catalog, with deep links, at: https://www.cu.edu/employee-services/eld/catalog
- Users must log on separately to access other resources on Skillsoft.

## Creating a Deep Link to a Course, Book, or Video

From the campus portal (my.cu.edu):

- 1. Select the Skillsoft tile.
- 2. Navigate to the course you want to link, and click the course title.
- 3. From the **About** tab, make note of the **Library ID**. For example, \_scorm12\_cu\_u00063\_0001. Library IDs vary by course and resource type.



- 4. Create a link using one of the following syntax examples (no spaces, no returns):
  - To link directly to the course, use the following syntax:

https://universityofcolorado.skillport.com/skillportfe/custom/login/saml/l
ogin.action?courseaction=launch&assetid=

• To link directly to the course's landing page within Skillsoft, where the learner can find a course description and information about the course's duration before launching it, use the following syntax:

https://universityofcolorado.skillport.com/skillportfe/custom/login/saml/login.action?courseaction=Summary&assetid=

- 5. Depending on the type of asset (course, video, or book), append this link text as follows:
  - For a course: append the complete Library ID to the end of the link text. For example, the following link goes directly to the CU Information Security and Privacy Awareness course:

- For a book: append \_ss\_book: followed by the Library ID.
- For a video: append \_ss\_video: followed by the Library ID.
