### Pro Forma Debt Service Coverage<sup>1</sup>

The Gross Revenues for the Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2016 as such term is defined in the Resolution, (including the Build America Bond Subsidy Payments received in FY 2016 with respect to the Subseries 2009B-2 Bonds, the Series 2010A Bonds and the annual QECB Subsidy Payments with respect to the Series 2010C that total \$3.243 million) equaled \$1,413,912,000. FY 2016 Operating and Maintenance Expenses (as defined in the Resolution) were \$345,854,000. Therefore, the Net Revenues for Fiscal Year 2016 as calculated in accordance with the Resolution, were \$1,068,058,000.

Fiscal Year 2016 Net Revenues, so calculated, divided by the Maximum Annual Debt Service of \$131,371,000 (occurring in Fiscal Year 2019), payable on Outstanding Parity Bonds of \$1,527,790,000 was 8.1x.
