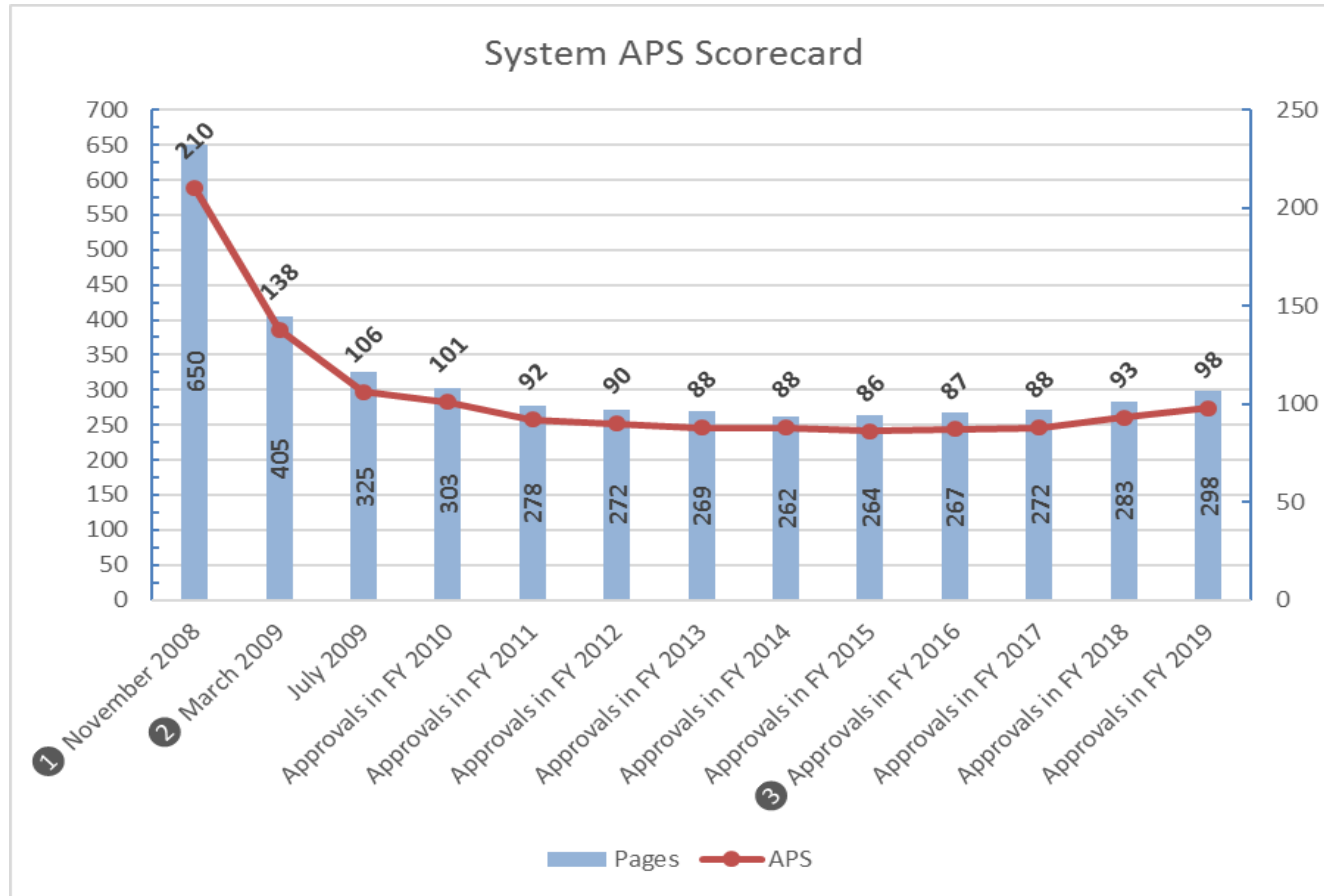

As a result, the Regents endorsed the adoption of an Emergency Tuition Stabilization Plan. Further, the Regents established within the Regents' Metrics a goal of each campus identifying resources equal to four percent of General Fund revenue. Progress toward the goal will be reported annually. This change to APS 4058 codifies the Regent's intent.	1-Jul-19
