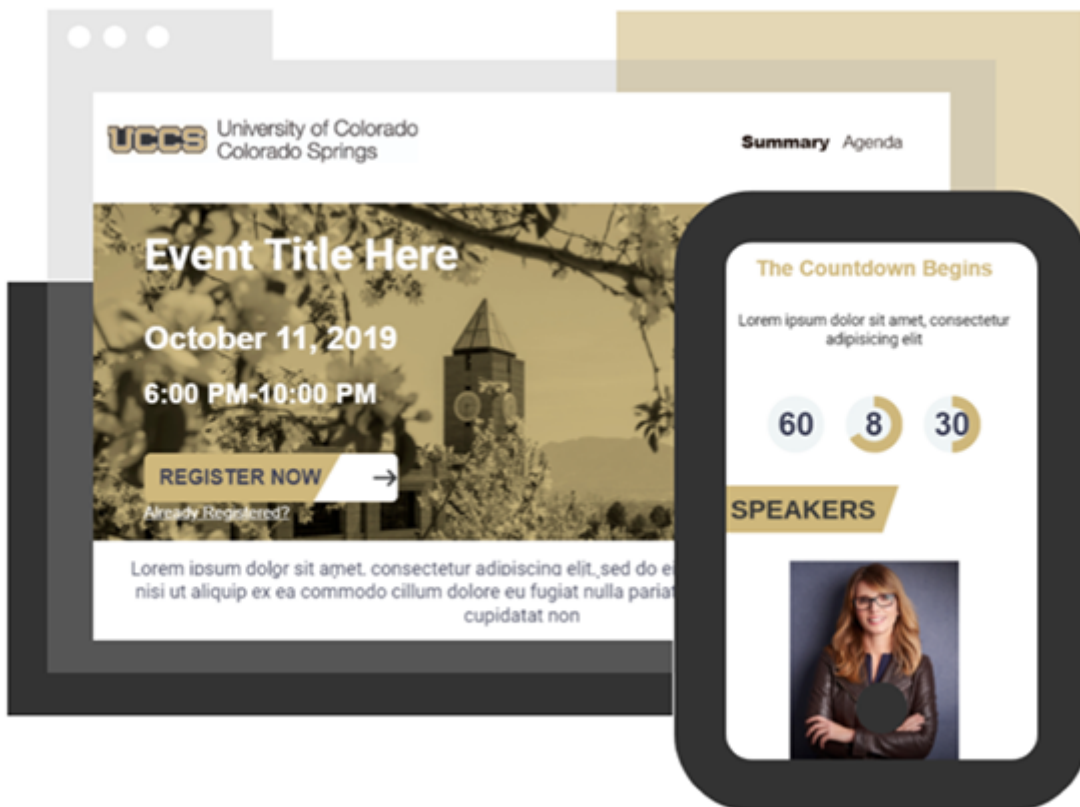


Cvent Flex | What is it? ^[1]

With a simplified approach to building your event website, Flex allows you to quickly create a modern attendee experience ^[3]. The new drag-and-drop site designer puts you in control: create one-, two-, or ten-page registration processes, add videos, customize image sidershows, and create excitement with countdown timers. The new undo/redo and version history features can help you view your progress over time and correct mistakes quickly.
