Do you find yourself making two clicks every time you log in to Marketing Cloud to navigate to Email Studio? Set your Default Login Preference to Email to skip that step when logging in. Here's how:

- Log in to your Marketing Cloud account
- Hover over your **username** (top-right) and select **Cloud Preferences**
 - If you are presented with a red warning, disregard and click the X in the top-right corner
- Click the **Default Login Preference** tab in the top navigation
- Click the radio button next to **Email**
- Click **Save** button (bottom-left)
