During his February trip, Zurbuchen attended a VIP breakfast and toured the Laboratory for Atmospheric and Space Physics (LASP), conversed with students from the Colorado Space Grant Consortium, and participated in a Q&A with College of Engineering and Applied Sciences students and faculty on SMD priorities.

CU Boulder Chancellor DiStefano Hosts Visiting Scholar Francis Beckwith

University of Colorado Boulder Chancellor Phil DiStefano hosted two Conservative Thought and Policy Program events in Colorado Springs and Parker with 2016-2017 Visiting Scholar Francis Beckwith. CU Boulder Aerospace Summit

Almost a dozen legislators attended CU Boulder's Aerospace Summit. The program highlighted CU Boulder's renowned space science programs and central role in the CO aerospace industry. Lt. Governor Donna Lynne joined CU Boulder Chancellor Phil DiStefano,

multiple faculty from CU Boulder's aerospace programs and several other key stakeholders from the state.

CU Boulder Hill Visits

There have been several recent Hill visits by CU Boulder faculty:

- Greg Atkins, Director of the Bursar's Office, and Lora Smith-Merriweather, Manager of Student Loans and Debt Management, met with members of the Colorado congressional delegation in DC including Congressman Jared Polis to discuss the importance of federal Perkins loans to CU Boulder students. The current extension of the Perkins Loan program will expire on Sept. 30, 2017. Colleagues from the Coalition of Higher Education Assistance Organizations (COHEAO) and Heather Bené from CU's federal team also participated in the meetings, which took place January 31.
- Stew Elliott and JaNae Ketterling from the Office of Veteran Services (OVS) met with staff with the offices of Senators Michael Bennet and Cory Gardner as well as Congressman Jared Polis to discuss veterans' education programs and current OVS projects. Elliott and Ketterling also met with the House and Senate Veterans Affairs Committees and attended the National Association of Veterans' Program Administrators (NAVPA) meeting.
- Brian Sanders from the Colorado Space Grant Consortium met with a number of Colorado's congressional offices to discuss federal support for Space Grant in FY 2018.
 The visits were part of this year's national Space Grant Advocacy Day on Capitol Hill.
- Waleed Abdalati and Kristen Averyt from the Cooperative Institute for Research in Environmental Sciences (CIRES) met with staff for Senators Michael Bennet and Cory Gardner and Congressmen Jared Polis and Ed Perlmutter to discuss a number of CIRES' priorities, including support for earth sciences in the FY 2018 budget.
- Kathryn Penzkover from CU Science Discovery as well as participants from the K-12 Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM) outreach program - met with their hometown legislators, including Congressman Jared Polis and Ed Perlmutter. Senator Cory Gardner's office also hosted the students for a tour of the Capitol. During the trip, the students also attended the Emerging Researchers National Conference in STEM, a national conference for young researchers sponsored by the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS).
- Valerio Ferme, Associate Dean for the Arts and Humanities, represented CU Boulder along with several national associations to attend National Humanities Alliance (NHA) advocacy day. The group urged continued funding for the humanities, as well as Title VI International Education programs and Fulbright-Hays. President Trump's FY18 Budget Blueprint targets both the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) and Title VI for elimination.
- Juliane Shindo and Rebecca Downey from International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) joined NAFSA: Association of International Educators for meetings to discuss the association's current international education priorities. Members met with Colorado lawmakers including Senators Michael Bennet and Cory Gardner, and Congressmen Jared Polis, Diana DeGette and Doug Lamborn.
