

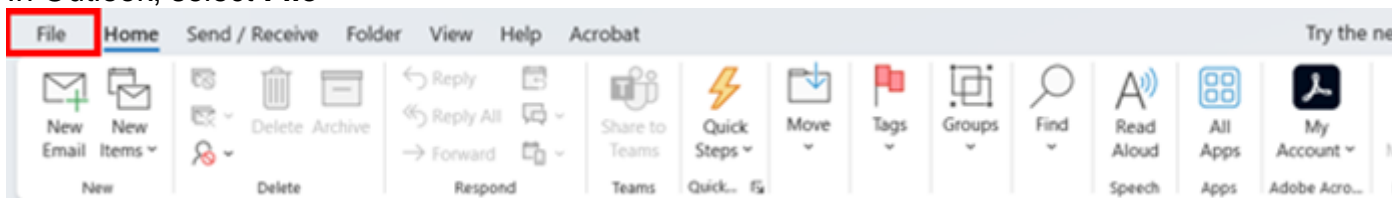
## Select your default browser for links in Outlook [1]

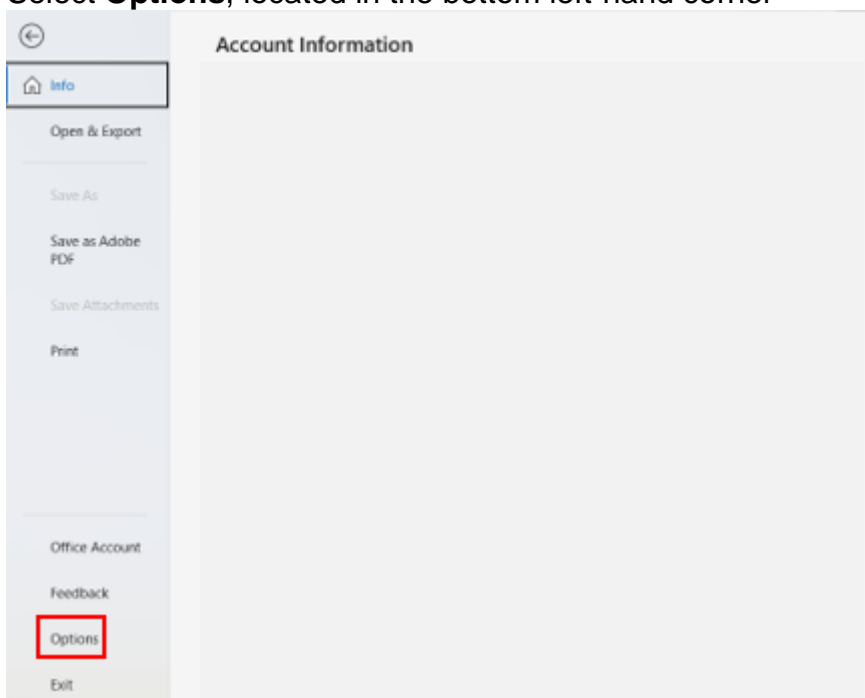
As of November 2023, all links opened in Microsoft Outlook automatically open in Microsoft Edge. Although this doesn't override your default browser in Windows, links will only open in Edge until the setting is disabled.

### Disabling Edge as the default browser for links in Outlook

1. In Outlook, select **File**



2. Select **Options**, located in the bottom left-hand corner



3. In the options menu, select **Advanced**. Then, under the **File and browser preferences** tab, change the **Open hyperlinks in Outlook in:** option to

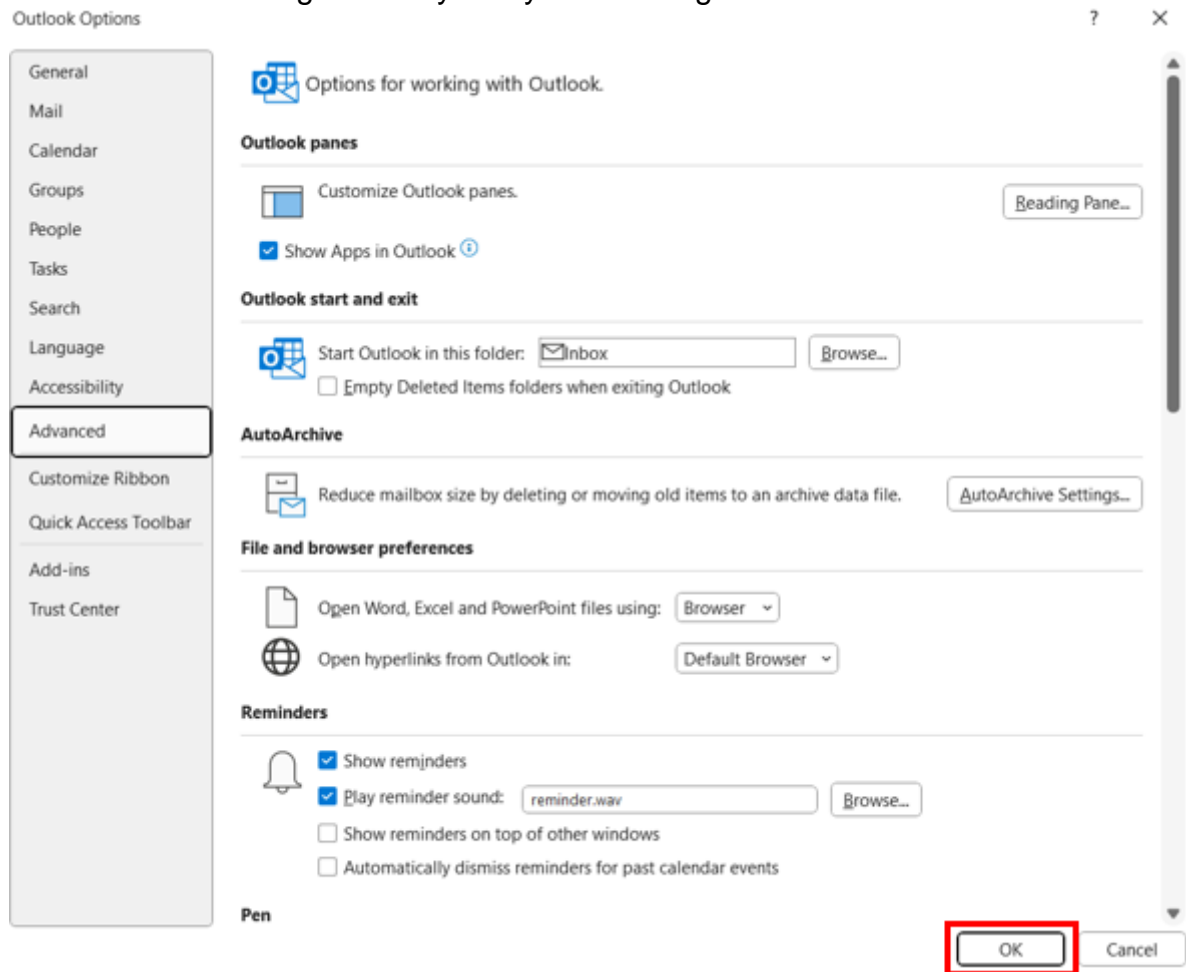
