The Coleman Institute for Cognitive Disabilities was established in 2001 by the Regents of the University of Colorado. A private endowment and sustained annual contributions by our founding donors, Bill and Claudia Coleman, support the Institute's activities through the Coleman Colorado Foundation (CCF). CCF is a 501 (c) (3) public charity and is classified as a 509 (a) (3) supporting organization to CU that supports the Coleman Institute.
