Get help filing your taxes

To assist with U.S. tax return preparation, nonresident alien students and employees who are sponsored by CU have the option to use Sprintax software.

All eligible international students and scholars received an access code to Sprintax Returns through their CU-affiliated email for 2024. If you have not received an access code by March 8, 2024, email intltax@cu.edu ^[3].
