<b>CU: Clery Act Compliance and Campus Security Authority (CSA) Training</b>	Required for all Campus Security Authorities designated by CU Boulder.	<p>This 40-minute course is a thorough introduction to the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act (Clery Act), which is a federal law that requires institutions of higher education to collect and report campus crime data, support victims of violence, and publicly outline the police and procedures they have in place to improve campus safety. As part of this requirement, CU Boulder is required to identify, notify, and train all Campus Security Authorities who carry out many of these responsibilities, which this training will cover in depth.</p> <p>HCM Course Code: u00287</p> <p><a href="#">Start Course</a> <sup>[7]</sup></p>
<b>CU: Emergency Management's Student Affairs Crisis Response Training</b>	Required for Student Affairs Staff.	<p>After completing this 30-minute course, staff will develop an understanding of Emergency Management functions and the emergency response structure at CU Boulder, be able to identify the role that Student Affairs plays in emergency/crisis response at CU Boulder, be able to outline how Student Affairs and Emergency Management collaborate during emergencies, and be able to identify essential functions within Student Affairs as they relate to emergency/crisis response.</p> <p>HCM Course Code: u00245</p> <p><a href="#">Start Course</a> <sup>[8]</sup></p>

<b>CU: Warning Signs for Violence and Strategies for Upstander Reporting</b>	Recommended for faculty, staff, and students.	<p>This 40-minute course for faculty, staff, and students, is meant to educate the University of Colorado community about rates of violence and the warning signs for violence, as well as raise awareness about the role of upstanders in violence prevention on campus and in our community.</p> <p>HCM Course Code: u10129</p> <p><a href="#">Start Course</a> <sup>[11]</sup></p>
