Secure File Transfer Protocol (SFTP) [1]

Overview:

CU's Secure File Transfer Program (SFTP) is used by customers to upload files for batch processing and to provide short-term storage to aid in collaboration between staff and vendors.

Benefits: Some of the benefits of SFTP include:

- 24/7 file transfer services capabilities
- Centralized location for short-term file storage
- Secure file transfer for campuses, customers (<u>Finance [2]</u>, <u>HRMS [3]</u>, <u>UC4 [4]</u>, <u>CIW/Cognos [5]</u>, <u>Campus Solutions [6]</u>, <u>DATC [7]</u>) and vendors
- Validates and authorizes files uploaded for batch processing and storage

Who is eligible to use the service: Any CU staff member or vendor with a need to upload or download files to the university via SFTP.

How to request access to the service: Refer to the <u>Access</u> [8] website to request access to SFTP. (Note: Must be on a CU network to access this restricted website.)

Alias Information / Service History: SFTP or Secure FTP. Used to be called Dilbert.
