









## Disabling Pop-up Blockers



Pop-up windows, or pop-ups, are windows that appear automatically without your permission. Some websites, including some banking sites, use pop-ups for important features. Blocking all pop-ups disables such features. To allow specific websites to use pop-ups, while still blocking all others, you can add those specific websites to the list of allowed sites.

### For Internet Explorer (10 or 11):

1.	To disable pop-ups for Internet Explorer 10 or 11, open any website.  This demonstration will use the Office of University Controller (OUC) website: <a href="http://www.cu.edu/controller">www.cu.edu/controller</a> .
2.	Click <b>Tools</b> ...  Tools or 
3.	...then <b>Internet Options</b> . 
4.	Click the <b>Privacy</b> tab. 
5.	Click <b>Settings</b> in the POP-UP BLOCKER section. 
6.	Enter the website address you want to allow pop-ups from in the <b>Address of website to allow</b> field. It is not necessary to type the "http://" or "https://" to the beginning of the address.  <b>Which websites should be allowed?</b> -- *.cu.edu -- *.cusys.edu  The "*" acts as a wildcard, thereby allowing any site with cu.edu or cusys.edu in the web address.
7.	Click <b>Add</b> .  Repeat the previous step and this step to add any desired additional allowed sites. 
8.	Click <b>Close</b> . 
9.	Click <b>OK</b> in the INTERNET OPTIONS window.




### For Mozilla Firefox:

1	<p>To disable pop-ups for Mozilla Firefox, open any website.</p> <p>This demonstration will use the Office of University Controller (OUC) website: <a href="http://www.cu.edu/controller">www.cu.edu/controller</a>.</p>
2	Click <b>Tools...</b>
3	...then <b>Options...</b>
4	Click the <b>Content</b> list item.
5	<p>Click the first <b>Exceptions...</b> button, to the right of the <b>Block pop-up windows</b> checkbox.</p> 
6	<p>Enter the website address you want to allow pop-ups from in the <b>Address of web site</b> field. It is not necessary to type the "http://" or "https://" to the beginning of the address.</p> <p><b>Which websites should be allowed?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>-- *.cu.edu</li><li>-- *.cusys.edu</li></ul> <p>The "*" acts as a wildcard, thereby allowing any site with cu.edu or cusys.edu in the web address.</p>
7	<p>Click <b>Allow</b>.</p> <p>Repeat the previous step and this step to add any desired additional allowed sites.</p> 
8	Click <b>Save Changes</b> .
9	Close the OPTIONS window.




### For Mozilla Firefox on your Mac:

1	<p>To disable pop-ups for Mozilla Firefox on your Mac computer, open any website.</p> <p>This demonstration will use the Office of University Controller (OUC) website: <a href="http://www.cu.edu/controller">www.cu.edu/controller</a>.</p>
2	Click <b>Firefox...</b>

## Disabling Pop-up Blockers

3	... then <b>Preferences...</b>
4	On the CONTENT page, click the first <b>Exceptions...</b> button (to the right of the <b>Block pop-up windows</b> checkbox). 
5	Enter the website address you want to allow pop-ups from in the <b>Address of web site</b> field. It is not necessary to type the "http://" or "https://" to the beginning of the address.  <b>Which websites should be allowed?</b> -- www.cu.edu -- www.cusys.edu
6	Click <b>Allow</b> .  Repeat the previous step and this step to add any desired additional allowed sites. 
7	Click <b>Close</b> (red circle in upper left corner of the ALLOWED SITES - POPUPS window). 
8	<b>End of Procedure.</b> Remaining steps apply to other paths.

### For Safari on your Mac

10.	To disable pop-ups for Safari on your Mac computer, open any website.  This demonstration will use the Office of University Controller (OUC) website: www.cu.edu/controller.
11.	Click <b>Safari...</b> 
12.	... then <b>Preferences...</b> 
13.	On the SECURITY page, uncheck <b>Block pop-up windows</b> checkbox. 
14.	Click <b>Close</b> (red circle in upper left corner of the SECURITY window).
