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19   20		(A)	Each year the vice president, university counsel and secretary of the board will solicit nominees for these awards. The nNomination deadline is November	
21			September 15. Late or incomplete nomination packages will not be considered.	
22			Anyone may submit a nomination.	
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24   25		(B)	Honorary Degree, University Medal, and Distinguished Service Award nominations must be submitted on <u>line</u> the award nomination form and supported	
26			by <u>at least</u> three, <del>and <u>but</u> not more than five, letters of recommendation, including</del>	
27			the nominator's letter. The nominator will provide the recommendation letters and	
28			the nominee's current vita, and contact informationaddress, and telephone	
29 30			number. The complete nomination package must be submitted to the Office of the Vice President, University Counsel and Secretary of the Board of Regents by	
30			the deadline date.

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44 (D) Each chancellor will designate a campus Regents Awards Canvassing 45 Committee that encourages gualified nominations. The vice president, university 46 counsel and secretary will accept any qualified nomination not submitted through 47 a campus canvassing committee, but will forward the nomination package to the 48 respective canvassing committee for formal submittal on behalf of the respective 49 campus. Chancellors will identify the chair of the canvassing committee to the 50 secretary to facilitate nomination referrals to the committee. 51 52 (E) The campus canvassing committees will submit gualified nominations to the 53 secretary of the board to forward to the Regents Awards Selection Committee by 54 October 1. The Regents Awards Selection Committee will be composed of four of 55 the regents on the University Affairs Committee and four faculty members of the 56 Faculty Council on the Educational Policy and University Standards (EPUS) 57 committee. 58 59 (F) All nominations will be considered confidential and be discussed at the annual 60 January October meeting of the Regents Awards Selection Committee. 61 62 The Regents Awards Selection Committee will forward the its recommendations (G) 63 of candidates for rRegents aAwards to the full board for action at their its 64 regularly scheduled Board of Regents November meeting in November. 65 66 9.A.3 (H) To receive an Honorary Degree, the selected candidates selected or the candidate's 67 representative must attend a university commencement within a two-year period 68 following selection. University Medals or Distinguished Service Awards are generally 69 awarded at commencements but may be awarded on other occasions, as determined by 70 the board. 71 72 (I) Nominees A candidate who is not selected for an award may be resubmitted for 9.A.4 73 reconsideration re-nominated if new information (such as additional accomplishments) is 74 cited in the nomination package.
